**Notes:** The scans appear in the order that the cards were in the file drawers. They may be out of order.

The images are word searchable. However, due to the deteriorating condition of the index cards we suggest you browse the card images and not rely on OCR.

Note that there is no indication of how long the article is; often no mention of what church or clergyman performed the ceremony or where; and note also that the names might be spelled differently. Wickoff is often indexed as Wyckoff; Nicols as Nichols, or Nickels; Wicks as Wickes, Wyckes, and so on. The index was created as part of a Depression era project, and the indexers took the spellings as they appeared in the papers.
