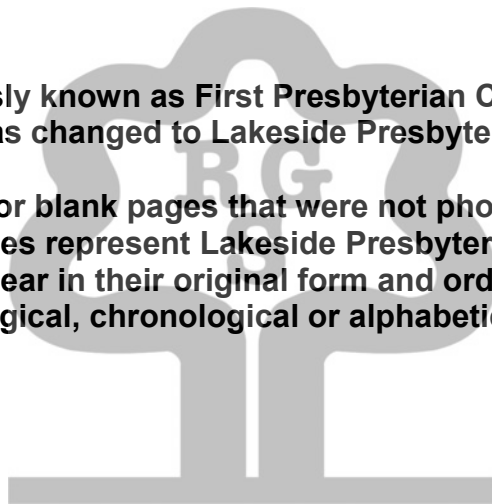

The new Church which had been in course of erection since the Spring of the year was dedicated to the service of Almighty God on Tuesday Evening Oct. 27, 1903. The edifice was the result of the enterprising labor of the congregation, which had looked forward for several years for a suitable sanctuary in which to offer the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. At a meeting of the congregation held on March 1903 the following Building Committee was appointed: A. P.
