**ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION OF THE PARISH MISSION
OF ST. LUKE'S CHURCH**

III

**THE OBLIGATIONS DEVOLVING UPON THE COMPONENT
ORGANIZATIONS**

Each and every organization represented in the Council, including those represented by a head of an allied organization, shall report to the Council as and when required.

In case the head of any organization having a place in the Council shall be unable to attend any general or special meeting of the Council, he or she, as the case may be, shall have a substitute present qualified to give full information concerning the affairs and activities of that particular organization and to make such report as may be expected therefrom. A substitute may participate in the discussions of the Council, but shall not be entitled to vote.

The several organizations shall keep lists of their members which show those of their members who are active and those who are honorary or contributing members. They shall also keep a permanent record of their meetings, with the names of those present at each meeting, and a permanent record also of their activities from which it will be possible to learn the work in hand and the work accomplished.

Every organization represented in the Council shall hold regular meetings at least once a month.

None of these organizations shall make general appeals for funds without the approval of the Council.

Each and every organization shall have at all times a committee whose special duty it shall be to know its active members, and, if members are absent from consecutive meetings and unaccounted for, to learn the reason why.

The organizations shall all hold elections as directed by the Council.

On the afternoon of Jan. 9th. a large number of the Women's Aux. had the pleasure of listening to Mr. Rudlow, who for some years has been connected with missionary work at Ha Chuang, China. His subject was "The women of China". Following Mr. Rudlow's talk was an informal business meeting.

Mr. Tyler asked that every woman in the Parish become a member of the Aux. and sign a card pledging to give a stated sum each month. Many responded, with the result that the Aux. is on a better financial basis than it has been in some time.

Owing to the demands upon Mrs. Davis, from the Red Cross Chapter, she found it necessary to resign as President of the Auxiliary.

Mrs. T. W. Shannon was elected Pres. and Mrs. Henry Marks, Treas. in Mrs. Shannon's place. Mrs. Eugene Arnold was made Asst. Treas.

Mrs. Shannon took the Chair and after a few remarks the meeting adjourned.

At the Jan. meeting Mr. Allison spoke of the work at Iola Sanatorium and of the need of bibles to be used there. Immediately money was given for twenty-five copies.
