Chile is the most enterprising country of South America; It is entirely on the west-ern slope of the Andes.

Chile has 80 cities of over 5,000 inhabitants.

The Amazon is the largest river on the globe, being over 3,000 miles in length; it rises in Peru, flows east into the Atlantic Ocean; its mouth is divided by Marajo Island, and is 80 miles on one side and 50 on the other.

Cayenne is noted for its spices and especially red-pepper.

Chile has better schools than other South American countries; primary education is compulsory.

N. Y. & N. E. R. R. extends along the east bank of the Hudson; four track road, crosses at Albany. N. Y. C. & W. S. R. R. extends along the west bank of the Hudson. Grand Central Depot, at New York, covers four acres.

Palisades are high banks of the Hudson R., two miles long from New York, and is the first point of interest on the Hudson.

Tappan Bars, on which Sing Sing is situated, is the next point of interest.

West Point, a bluff 235 ft. high, where the U. S. Military Academy is situated, for the education of soldiers, for the U. S. Army.

Washington gave Benedict Arnold's charge of West Point, during the revolution.

Arnold acted traitor, and tried to give West Point to the English; but Washington prevented the English from taking it, by putting a heavy chain across the river to entrap the English Fleet.

Next point of interest is Newburg, where Washington's Headquarters were situated. His army disbanded at Newburg, and his home is still kept up by the state. Vassar College is situated at Poughkeepsie. Kingston, which is on a high bluff, and which gives a good view of the Catskill Mts., is the northern terminus of the Delaware Canal.

Hudson, also on a bluff 45 ft. above the river; the large ocean steamers go up the river, as far as Albany, and the smaller ones, as far as Troy.

Albany, the state capital, contains a capitol building, which covers 3 acres. Poughkeepsie, on the eastern bank of the Hudson, has an active river trade; large manufacturing interests, extensive iron-furnaces, and foundries. It is the seat of Vassar College.



Hudson is on the east bank of the Hudson, at the head of ship-navigation; it has a large river trade, extensive iron-works, and various manufactures.

Troy, on the left bank of the Hudson, six miles above Albany, is the southern terminus of Champlain Canal, and an important rail-road center.

Albany, on the west bank of the Hudson, 145 mi. from New York, is the capital city. It is the terminus of the Erie Canal, and an important rail-road center. It has a large trade in grain and lumber, extensive iron-foundries, and car-wheel factories, carriages, soap, and candles, saws, ginches, and cabinet-furniture. It is the seat of the Geological and Agricultural Hall, the state library, the Dudley Observatory, and the State Normal School. The new capitol is, next to the federal capitol at Washington, the largest and most splendid edifice of the kind

in America.

Cohoes is at the junction of the Hudson with the Mohawk, and near the junction of the Champlain and Erie Canals. The Mohawk affords immense water-power, and the city is noted for its extensive manufactures of cotton-goods, also of hosiery and knitted-goods, and for its rolling-mills, saw-factories, and manufactories of pins and knitting-needles.

Schenectady, on the south bank of the Mohawk River, is noted for its locomotive-works, broom-manufactories, knitting-mills, etc. It is the seat of Union College.

Utica, on the Mohawk River, is an important rail-road center, and has great canal facilities. It carries on manufacturing industries, and has a large cheese trade. It is the seat of the State Lunatic Asylum, and other charitable institutions.

Rome, on the Mohawk R., is noted for its rolling and puddling-mills, paper-mills, and sash, blind, and planing-mills, locomotive and car works. It is the site of Fort Sanwix.

Syracuse, at the junction of the N. Y. C. and other railroads, is noted for its immense salt-works, and its varied manufactures of iron and steel, agricultural instruments, glass, furniture, musical instruments, etc. It is the seat of Syracuse University, and of the New York Asylum for Idiots.

Rochester is a port of entry at the falls of the Genesee River, seven miles from L. Ontario, and at the junction of several important rail-road lines. It has immense water-power, and large manufactures and milling interests, and is the center of trade for the fertile Genesee Valley. Near Rochester are the most extensive fruit and ornamental trees in the world. It is the seat of Rochester University, Rochester Theological

Seminary, and of the Western Home of Refuge, an important Reformatory.

Lockport is on the Erie Canal, where it descends 60 ft. by five double locks. Immense water-power is distributed from the canal to the manufactories by means of a hydraulic canal,  $\frac{2}{3}$  of a mile long. The chief manufactures are those of flour, lumber, and cotton and woolen-goods.

Buffalo, a port of entry, and county-seat of Erie County, has a splendid water-front, on Lake Erie and the Niagara R. Its harbor, formed partly by Buffalo R., and protected by extensive break-waters, is one of the finest on the lakes. The chief characteristics of Buffalo are its healthful and pleasant situation, handsome parks, wide streets, elegant private mansions, fine public buildings, excellent schools, and abundant supply of water from the Niagara, its extensive



manufactures of iron, copper, and brass goods,  
furniture, and flouring mill products, and  
its grain trade, facilitated by its nume-  
rous large elevators.
