

## First United P resbyterian Church Rochester, New York.

The First United Presbytarian Church of Rochester, N. Y. effected its organization September 21, 1849 as the First Associate Reformed Church of Rochester. Previous to organization the Rev. John Vantaton had conducted services for a little more than a year, first in a school house on Fitzings. Street near the Saint Luke's Episcopal Church, and then in a school house on the corner of Plymouth Avenus and Troup Street.

On September 8, 1850, less than a year after the congregation was organized, the lately reconstructed house of worship at Plymouth Avenue and Troup Street was consumed by fire. Following this services were held for four months in a school house on Allen Street between Pitshugh and State Streets, then in a building on the corner of Court and Stone Streets, continuing there until 1864, when purchase was made of the church on Allen Street near Fitzhugh Street.

In the union of the Associate Presbyterian Synod and the Accordate Reformed Presbyterian Synod on May 26, 1858 to form the United Presbyterian Church of North America, this congregation became the United Presbyterian Church of Rochester. Since the establishing of the Laurelton congregation it has been known in the city as the First United Presbyterian Church.

The present house of worship on Plymouth Avenue North was dedicated in 1960.

The ainisters who have served the congregation and the time of their services are as follows:

Rev. John VanPaton began his service in August of 1848 and closed it

in February of 1853. Rev. T. L. MoAdams began his service in June of 1854 and closed it

in February of 1857. Rev. Thomas P. Boyd began his service in October of 1857 and closed

it in March of 1868. Rev. James P. Sankey, D. D. began his service in June of 1864 and closed it in June of 1965, a long pastorate of 41 years.

Rev. John Heslip began his service in September of 1905 and closed it in September of 1912.

Rev. Marvin J. Thompson, D. D. began his service in June of 1913 and closed it in October of 1920.
