Mr. Warner mentioned having discussed with Dr. King the matter of care of outside and facilities after meetings. He felt that the head of each group should be advised of the necessary care of properties. A general discussion indicated a general conference with the idea of assigning the responsibility to those holding meetings. It was felt that each organization should be given a general idea of the proper location of each major item. It was felt the answer was a development of a sense of responsibility on the part of those using the property. It was considered that the organizations should be notified at the beginning of the fall season of activities.

In regard to the placement of the church mortgage, Mr. Galt reported the rate would in the judgement of the Union Trust Company officials be about $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. Legal fees would be about \$150.00, with the cost to the church in addition about \$100.00. Cost of a \$1,000 mortgage would be about \$200.00 annually for interest with an additional \$5.00 a quarter to include payment on principal. A statement of pledges, income and expenses for the past three years will be required in order to proceed.

Lincoln Rochester officials reported to Dr. King on the basis of reports for the past three years, and estimated projects for the next two years. A five year loan of \$1,000 would carry a rate of about 5%, with no legal arrangements necessary. Mr. Wilson was asked to prepare an estimate of church income and expenses for the next two years, and the result would be discussed at a special meeting of elders and trustees after church on Sunday May 15th.
