COMMITTEE REPORTS

Church in Society: R. DeLapp and J. Cochran appeared before Session to discuss request from November meeting to make community outreach a major direction of the

church. It was moved by Christopher and seconded by Brule to approve the concept of the program submitted (although not necessarily the specifics as outlined). Motion carried.

Ministerial Relations: McKibben reported. Moved by Thurling and seconded by Reynolds to appoint the present MR committee plus the clerk of session as a committee to write up the church's goals as a first step in the process of finding permanent pastors and to submit them to session as soon as possible. Motion carried.

It was further <u>moved</u> by Brule and seconded by Thurling that the Nominating Committee develop a committee it feels represents the congregation (3 members to be from session and 4 from the congregation) to find an assistant pastor. Motion carried.

Trustees and Treasurer: Carey reported and circulated written reports.

Stewardship: Showalter reported that 66% of the proposed budget has been pledged to date.

Nominating: Levering reported and circulated a proposed slate of church officers for 1980. It was moved by Thurling and seconded by Ardizzone to accept the entire slate as presented. Motion carried.

Building Committee: Report given by Levering and written report circulated from committee.

It was <u>moved</u> by Thurling and seconded by Levering to permit the Building Committee to open a money market fund account with liquidity comparable to a checking account for the purpose of depositing excess funds over the minimum amount necessary to pay current bills. Motion carried.

It was moved by Thurling and seconded by Harp to sanction a plan to communicate the needs of the building program to be worked out with the Discovery Group coordinators and communicated to individual group members by their leadership couples in order to achieve pledges from active non-Parkminster members. Motion carried.

It was moved by Reynolds and seconded by Frazier to have a mailing to all pledging units to the long-term (1980-82) building fund need in order to give them a card reminder of the amount they pledged during the building fund campaign. Motion carried.

Christian Education: Ardizzone reported.

Worship and Music: Reynolds reported. It was moved by Reynolds and seconded by Frazier to offer the position of Assistant Organist to Jeanne Houpt. Motion carried.

It was reported that \$860 was budgeted, plus \$600 more, for the directors of choirs. \$860 will be paid to the junior choir director and \$600 will be split amongst the other six.

The motion was seconded by Christopher and passed.

McKibben read a letter from Rev. Barcus requesting an extension for use of the manse through February and possibly March. It was <u>moved</u> by Levering and seconded by Bender to allow the Barcus family to remain in the manse until the end of February, at which time they are to move elsewhere. Motion carried.

The Rev. W. James Gerling, our Presbytery ministerial relations person, visited Session and reviewed the ground rules for the pulpit search committee. He also expressed the need to develop a relationship with Session. He will be in close contact with the pulpit committee.

Tom Lynn visited Session and shared his need to know when and if he should quit his full time job to better concentrate on his full time ministerial studies.

at the end of the proposal. The Session wishes not to formally sign the proposal before the Presbytery presentation.

Building Committee: Levering reported a March 1 completion date for work plans. There is a serious shortage of funds - \$40,000 per year. A treasurer for 1980 is needed. It was moved by Ardizzone and seconded by Price to reappoint Levering as the committee treasurer through 1980. Motion carried.

The Building Committee recommended that another committee be appointed for

arranging the Showalter manse addition. Session concurs.

It was moved by McKibben and seconded by Bradley to ask the Nominating Committee to appoint a committee to arrange the manse addition, giving preference to members of the former Space Committee who are not currently on the Building Committee. A membership of approximately 6 is recommended. Motion carried.

Recommendations made by Session for Sept. 18 meeting: a) Calculate the amount of 18½ interest already paid between April and September which was in excess of the 13% paid during the first 6 months of the building loan. Stress that the level of current and projected interest rates was never expected at the onset of the project; b) Church checking accounts have been moved to the Chili branch of Monroe Savings wherever possible.

Suggestions for reducing the proposed budget:

- (a) reduce paving and furnishings under "maintenance."
- (b) keep all salaries at the 1981 level.
- (c) eliminate the Assistant Minister's position.
- (d) therefore, also reduce benefits, car expenses & pension.
- (e) reduce Christian Education by \$2,000.
- reduce: (1) Church in Society by \$250; (2) Music by \$200; (3) Chancel by \$100; (4) Ministerial supplies by \$500.
- (g) reduce Outreach giving to 10% level.
- (h) eliminate any expense for radio ministry.

These reductions would amount to approximately \$43,860.

It was moved by Fuhrman and seconded by Bender to present two columns for the budget proposals in the Stewardship brochure--one as labeled "Proposed 1982 Budget" as presented by Trustees with changes recorded above, and one as a "bare bones budget" including the suggested reductions listed above. # COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: R. Thurling, V. Price, J. Swinehart and J. Preston visited to make a report and answer questions. The committee wants to set a goal of \$200,000 to be received from fund raising in addition to regular giving. Ways to raise the money would be: (1) gifts from members, and (2) bonds. The committee reviewed some basic assumptions their request is based on: (1) a gain of 5 members per year; (2) giving at present levels <u>plus</u> inflation, (3) 3D would keep their pledge, but no rental income would be received from tenants, (4) remain at present 2 ministers and 1 Christian Education person, plus staff would remain the same for maintenance, office and music and salaries would reflect inflation increases only; (5) interest expense would be 18% of outstanding debt; (6) building expenses would remain at 1982 levels with only inflation increases; (7) no benevolences until 1987, then increasing them by \$10,000 per year; and (8) a fund drive would raise \$200,000 in 1983.

Moved by Price and seconded by Palmer to launch a \$200,000 fund raising campaign through the end of 1983. Moved by Lish and seconded by McKibben to amend that amount to \$250,000. Motion carried.

It was <u>agreed</u> by common consent that the committee would meet to formulate a plan and get back to the Session with it in 2 weeks. It was felt that DUPC needs to be approached soon for "upfront" money. Also, a meeting has been scheduled with the Session and representatives of the Finance Committee on July 26.

It was <u>moved</u> by McClurg and seconded by Evans to have (1) Bob Thurling, or (2) Bill Showalter present a report to the congregation during the service Sunday on the current building financial status. Motion carried.

Stewardship: W. Christopher and W. Garnham visited to report. It was moved by Lish and seconded by Palmer that the Stewardship Committee use the "Love So Amazing" theme for this year with adaptations to better suit Parkminster's needs. Motion carried.

Radio and Tape Ministry: G. Frazier visited to report and answer questions. It was moved by Palmer and seconded by Price that the committee be given permission to offer duplicating services to all churches in the area and to possibly try to secure some commercial business. Motion carried.

It was <u>moved</u> by Harp and seconded by Palmer to grant permission for the committee to borrow money on a personal basis from church members at 14% interest up to \$4,000 to meet current needs. Motion carried.

Organ: It was moved by Bender and seconded by McKibben that the trustees should take responsibility for risers and floor covering in the loft in conjunction with the Worship and Music Committee and using Organ Committee funds. Motion carried.

Young Marrieds: It was moved by Avery and seconded by Price to approve their request for a change of date for their church-wide pizza party from Sept. 10 to Sept. 24, and to publicize same with a sign out in front of the church, an announcement in the Gates-Chili News, and flyers at local colleges. Motion carried.

Outreach: Moved by Evans and seconded by Fuhrman to approve a commissioning ceremony with the laying on of hands for the Tribleys during the Communion Service on Sunday, Aug. 1. Motion carried.

Moved by Avery and seconded by Price to grant permission for outreach to sponsor a dinner for the congregation with Philip Truesdale on Wednesday, Oct. 13. Motion carried.

Ministerial Relations: Moved by McKibben and seconded by Avery to grant the following times off: August 13 - September 6 for W. Showalter (which includes 4 days which are not vacation as they are to attend a conference); and August 17-21 for Daryl Staneck for vacation. Motion carried.

Trustees: Moved by McKibben and seconded by Lish that the following equipment loaning policy be approved: (1) It will be the policy of the Trustees to not loan tools and equipment; (2) It will be the policy of the Trustees to loan the following items within stated guidelines: (a) appliance moving dolly with stair helpers and belts. This does not include two-wheeled carton cart without stair helpers and belts; (b) tables, rectangular, folding only. No round, short-legged or card tables to be loaned. Oldest tables to be loaned first: (c) metal folding chairs. No wooden folding chairs or stackable chairs to be loaned. Oldest chairs to be loaned first; (3) all items loaned will be coordinated through the Trustee chairman. Coordination includes (a) check of conflicting schedule for use of equipment, (b) arrange specific times for pick-up and return which does not conflict with other scheduled church activities; (c) telephone check upon return. Motion carried.

Price reviewed new insurance values.

Moved by Lish and seconded by Price to approve the sale of 3 shares of Xerox stock upon approval of the donor for \$96. Motion carried.

After reviewing the monthly financial planning report, it was <u>moved</u> by Lish and seconded by Avery that we publish income vs. expense on an account basis next month in <u>Parkminster Life</u>. Motion carried.

Christian Education: It was agreed that \$1,500 be spent for fall supplies.

Bookstore: A formal lease held by the store runs through October of this year, George Evans is checking to see if we must pay through the end of October if the bookstore goes through with its current plans to close in August.

Nominations were opened for the Audit Committee. Irene Bly, David Harp and Walter Palmer were placed in nomination. It was <u>moved</u>, seconded and carried to close nominations and cast one unanimous ballot for the entire slate.

Nominations were placed upon the floor for the following: Diane Frazier for Corporate Chairperson; Robert Thurling for Alternate Corporation Chairperson; Elizabeth Causey for Corporation Treasurer; Carole Levering for Alternate Treasurer; Irene Bly for Corporation Clerk; Robert Illi for Financial Secretary. It was moved, seconded and carried to close nominations and cast one unanimous ballot for the entire slate.

Walter Priestley recognized the members of the Nominating Committee and thanked them for their efforts for the past year.

The meeting was turned over to Diane Frazier, the new Corporation Chairperson.

The next item of business was the presentation of the proposed 1986 budget with Jerry Fuhrman (Pastor Nominating Committee), Kenneth Avery (Committee on Ministry), and Paul Irvine (Trustees) as resource persons. Diane Frazier reminded those in attendance that the by-laws state that the congregation is not permitted to vote on the budget, with the exception of the Ministers' and Director of Christian Educations's salaries. However, Session did request recommendations, concerns and comments from the congregation regarding the proposed budget.

Paul Irvine requested pledges from the floor to pay off the small 12% loan costs, namely, manse mortgages, DUPC loan costs and telephone equipment loan. It was stated that if the loans could be paid off in 1986 the potential deficit might drop to \$12,000.00. The amount raised from the floor during the meeting was \$7,500. This will be applied directly to the principle.

There was discussion as to what was included in the salary and benefit plans for both positions. The study tuition for the Senior Pastor was questioned. It was explained that it was pro-rated for 1986 so it can continue in the future. It was suggested that the study tuition of \$420 for the Associate Pastor be increased to \$1,100. This was defeated, but it was moved, seconded and carried that the proposed salary package representing a 10% increase for the Associate Minister remain the same.

It was  $\underline{moved}$ , seconded and carried that the proposed salary package representing a  $5.6\overline{\chi}$  increase for the Director of Christian Education remain the same. The congregation discussed the remainder of the budget and a number of recommendations were listed for review by the Session.

It was stated that Outreach be kept as near to 10% of the proposed amount as possible or hopefully raised.

Any changes in the new budget will be published.

Corporation Chairperson Diane Frazier called for New Business. George Evans recognized the help of Bill Leyland's landscapting services throughout the past year. Diane Frazier asked the congregation members to pick up their year-end financial statements in the office.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS

Trustees: Leyland reviewed report. Copies of Financial Statement dated October 31, 1986, a Budget Analysis, and a graph showing giving against budget, were distributed to each person and reviewed by Priestley.

It was moved by Priestley and seconded that the 1986 budget be amended (reduced) to \$373,607. Priestley reviewed the budget analysis, giving rationale for reduction. Motion carried.

Priestley reported that the projected 1987 budget figure is \$369,711, which includes a 4% pay raise for all staff. Present pledging totals \$319,800, including the 22% figure.

Stewardship: Palmer reported on the Stewardship campaign. To date 145 pledges have been received for a total of \$262,186. Giving is up approximately 10% over last year and there are 24 new pledging units. 31 pledges remain outstanding. Elders/deacons are to contact within the week those persons on Caring Lists who have not yet pledged for 1987.

It was <u>moved</u> by Palmer and seconded that the Stewardship Committee form a sub-committee to investigate the possibility/feasibility/interest of offering Estate Planning to the congregation. <u>Carried</u>. Committee will report back to session on outcome of study and their recommendation.

Session spent some time discussing Stewardship Committee's question about percentage of Outreach pledging for future years. Session appreciates the committee's enthusiasm and creativity; committee was asked to discuss further and come back to Session with a long range goal for Outreach giving.

Outreach Committee: The service auction brought in \$4,000, enabling the church to make contributions of \$2,000 each to Cephas and Open Door Mission.

There was discussion about committee's request to have the "Jews for Jesus" put on a program in April 1987. Consensus of the session was not to invite them at this time.

Committee on Ministry. Moved by Avery and seconded to approve request for Sahrbeck vacation December 26-31, 1986. Carried.

InterVarsity request: Session agreed to have copies of the "IVCF Campus Update" available in the narthex for people to pick up if they would like. Congregation will be informed of the update through the announcement sheet.

Christian Education: Moved by Quinn and seconded to approve recommendation to hold Winters' Best Two Days program on Monday and Tuesday, December 29 and 30, 1986. Carried. Adult classes for January were reviewed. Concern was expressed about the problem of Sunday School attendance during the 9 a.m. hour and the increase during the church hour at 10:30 a.m. Teaching, during the first hour follows a planned curriculum, teachers are the same each week, yet attendance varies. During church hour, litle actual Bible teaching takes place; more emphasis on activities, etc. There was general discussion, however, no conclusion was reached.

Reports of Organ and Outreach Committees were reviewed, with no action required. The meeting was opened with teaching from the Scripture and prayer by Burnham.

There was a brief time of sharing pastoral/congregational concerns.

For session's information, Burnham reported offering figures for the past two Sundays, December 28, 1986 and January 4, 1987.

Trustees: Copies of a proposed 1987 budget, dated January 5, 1987, were distributed to session members. Pledging to date, plus 23%, totals \$349,144; the budget proposed by the trustees dated December 15, 1986 totaled \$337,092 and recommended eliminating the Director of Christian Education position. The proposed budget distributed at this meeting totaled \$349,156. The D.C.E. position remains in the most recently proposed budget, and budget cuts/reductions made in the following line items: Presbytery causes, Mission Development, office hours, improvements, salaries, continuing education for music staff personnel, and Burnham's meeting with congregation. It was moved by Avery and seconded that session work with the proposed budget dated January 5, 1987, which reflects the above-mentioned reductions. Carried.

Avery then presented two alternate suggestions for budget reductions, both of which totaled \$1460. His suggestion was to put back in the budget the line item of Burnham's meeting with the congregation. Discussion followed.

It was moved by Morse and seconded to approve the Outreach portion of the budget as presented (\$22,027). There was discussion pertaining to Outreach; should the Outreach budget be increased to a larger percentage of the Botal budget, i.e., a tithe.

A motion was made and seconded to table the motion; it was defeated. The motion was carried.

It was <u>moved</u> by Avery and seconded to reduce the following line items in the budget: stationery supplies (\$350); Stephen Ministries (\$1,000); Fire Department donation (\$25); Ambulance donation (\$25) - total \$1,400, and put back the line item of M. Burnham meetinging with the congregation.

At Burnham's request, Sahrbeck served as moderator for this portion of the meeting. There was lengthy discussion, with many comments/reactions/feelings, etc. shared by both elders and staff.

Priestley reported he had just received word from the Stewardship Committee of additional pledges. He amended the above motion to put in line item of \$1,120 for Burnham meeting with congregation, and not reduce/cut the other items as recommended. The motion was <u>carried</u> as amended.
