vi Price was invited to share with Session a personal concern. After silent prayer, there was discussion concerning the programs of the Church and what changes God might be calling us to. The Mission Statement of the Church was reviewed. Elders were asked to consider their commitment to each of the main focuses of the Statement, and to pray for each other daily, by name, in this regard. Burnham distributed a sheet on which elders were to record the minimum time per week they spend in the implementation of each goal, and that strengths and vulnerabilities concerning each would be shared at May's Seesion meeting.

It was moved by Quinn and seconded to send a letter of support and encouragement to the Crisis Pregnancy Center, particularly expressing gratitude for those from Parkminster who are involved there. Carried. Quinn will write the letter.

The role of the Moderator was discussed, including a critique of some past meetings.

#### TRUSTEE REPORT

Leyland expressed thanks for all who had helped during the recent flooding of the Social Hall.

It was moved by Priestley and seconded to establish a Capital Fund for the sole purpose of funding building improvements and mortgage debt reduction. Carried. An anonymous gift has been received to start such a fund. The Stewardship Committee is directed through their Session representative to prepare and have available information concerning wills, bequests, and possibilities for trust donations.

Based on receipts during the first quarter, annual receipts could reach \$420,000, about \$70,000 over budget. Even without counting the anonymous gift of \$10,000, we are slightly ahead of budget. It was mentioned that the chart outside the office needs to be updated.

All information requested by the bank for the mortgage negotiation has been supplied. Everything looks favorable for a mortgage rate of approximately 9.5 per cent. Little or no mortgage money will be saved this year because of closing costs; however, in 1988, there should be a savings of approximately \$2,000 per month.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stewardship: There was consensus to authorize the Committee to promote a special offering to Kirkhaven during May, Older Americans Month. Kirkhaven will provide bulletin inserts for advance publicity. The offering will be received on May 31, the same Sunday as Dr. Burham's scheduled commitment to conduct Kirkhaven's worship service. The congregation will be instructed to use the pew envelopes for their contribution.

Outreach: On Sunday, April 26 there will be a Moment for Mission advertising the World Relief offering to be received May 3. Also on April 26, the World Relief film, Crossfire, will be shown. Sterling Huston will be the Outreach Conference speaker on November 1.

Christian Education: A correction to last meeting's report: Dorothy Keefe is not Assistant Sunday School Superintendent. She will be involved with teacher training only. An Assistant Sunday School Superintendent is still being sought.

Church in Society Committee: In January, the Committee's activites were suspended with a commitment for re-evaluation in three months. There was consensus that the Nominating Committee should not staff the Church in Society Committee. Session will assume responsibility for handling issues as they are brought up. Weir Reception: All expenses for the reception were covered.

Pat Robertson Videotape: Mancini moved and it was seconded to grant permission for the showing of the Pat Robertson videotape. Carried.

<u>Evaluation of Small Groups</u>: It was agreed that the group coordinators will be asked to devise a forum for such evaluation with instructions to report their findings for Session review.

Ms. Mabon and Mr. Trout were invited to attend the meeting to further discuss and clarify the "More Light" issue. They discussed the remedial action process. They stated the purpose of the Permanent Judicial Commission is to review and rule on whether proper procedures have been followed as well as ruling on the issue. To proceed with a remedial case would require a demonstration that the "More Light" statement is out of order. They cautioned that this process would most likely hamper any meaningful dialogue although it is likely much unfocused discussion, which could not result in action, would result.

In summary, Ms. Mabon and Mr. Trout suggested that we need to be very clear about a remedial case and weigh the decision very carefully. Other options would be to request discussions with other sessions, be vulnerable, request Presbytery to make a stand, talk with other churches. It was suggested that we as a Session could issue a statement declaring our position regarding the homosexuality issue. They encouraged us to make decisions that have integrity for us as a Session and avoid devisiveness within our Session and congregation. We need to be together in whatever we do!

Session appreciated the discussion and many questions were answered. Thanks was expressed for the time and help given. The meeting continued following the departure of our guests at 8:00 p.m.

It was <u>moved</u> by Norr and seconded to send the Rev. Monty Burnham and two represesntatives of Session to enter into discussion on September 30 with the Session of Third Presbyterian Church. They are sent in the spirit of Ezekiel 33:1-9 to present our position that we feel we have a different interpretation of Biblical sexuality and we believe they are in error procedurally concerning their More Light position. <u>Passed</u>.

It was suggested that Price and Norr accompany Burnham on September 30. First alternate delegate is Avery.

# Special Task Force on Christian Education Final Report to Session - April 21, 1987

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION TASK FORCE REPORT

## PART II

The Task Force held five meetings.

## January 22

The meeting focused on better understanding session's four directives and discussing needs we perceived existed within Parkminster for Christian Education. We agreed to have each member of the committee survey three to five families concerning the needs of individuals and their concerns and opinions.

## February 5

The Task Force reviewed survey results in combination with committee member's needs lists. Major conclusions included: no glaring deficiency in overall program, those actively involved encouraged by the content of programs; problems with lack of commitment to adult Sunday School hour, the junior and senior high age programs, and the lack of a young adult program.

The major part of the evening was devoted to charting a vision for Christian Education at Parkminster Church-listing the objectives of the CE program. A mission statement entitled "Christian Education- a Family Affair at Parkminster" was developed.

## March 2

The Task Force took each item of the mission statement and, applying it to each age level, defined program and resources necessary to support it. A chart was produced listing the objectives, the programs, and these headings: Leadership, Plnners, Doers and Responsible Committee.

## March 12

At this meeting the Task Force learned of the resignation of Daryl Staneck. Daryl met with us that evening to go over the mission statement and the Task Force chart of how they could be carried out within our church. She made helpful additions and comments. After Daryl left, the Task Force began develping plans for how the work called for on the program and objective chart could be carried out by the staff and lay people of the church.

## March 23

At this final meeting the Task Force completed listing plans for handling the Christian Education program with different types of staffing: full time CED, part time CED, part time youth worker, the two ministers and no CE staff, and lay people. Pros and cons were listed for each situation. Recommendations to the session were also developed.

Task force commissioned to address the following questions.

- 1) Outline the mission of Christian Education at Parkminster.
- 2) Define the function of Christian Education at Parkminster.
- 3) Define the needs of Christian Education at Parkminster.
- Define a structure to carry out the above, including job descriptions of both lay and professional staff.

The Christian Ed. task force committee met five times to discuss and answer our charge. (A brief outline of committee meeting agenda is found in appendix A.) The committee initially conducted a limited survey to evaluate our current Christian Ed. program. The emphasis was to find out if program deficiencies existed. Survey results indicated general program was meeting congregations needs. Areas of concern were sited with Jr./Sr. High program, absence of young adult program and lack of adult commitment to attending 9:00 a.m. Sunday School time. Irrespective of task force committee's staffing recommendations, these areas of concern will require further study by both staff and Christian Ed. to effectively solve.

The committee's next action was to define the mission statment for Christian Education at Parkminster. Ten major goals were identified which became the basis for all progams. The committee then applied these goals to each age grouping within the congregation and recommended programs to best reinforce mission statement. Current programs along with potential new programs, were recommended where they reinforced goals. New program recommendations were identified to fill gaps and perceived weaknesses as we could best determine them. A detailed chart relating mission statement to program is found in appendix B. Review of this chart does show a vital active and exciting program currently exists meeting the basic needs of Christian Education at Parkminster.

The next step was to take each program and identify key aspects contributing to its success. Four major functions were identified; leadership, planners, doers and responsible committee. The leadership function was understood to be introduction and design of new programs, overall program coordination, lay leader training, motivation and support and program monitoring. The planning function was to establish program structure and outline, provide staffing and resources and detailed program coordination. The doers and responsible committee are self explanatory. A detailed chart showing these functions and recommended directions is found in appendix C.

As we approached the final question of required lay and professional staff to support outlined programs, our committee felt clearly that a full time Christian Education director could be effectively utilized. This would allow remaining staff free to support other areas of responsibility. The leadership function for an effective Christian Ed. program cannot be underestimated. The vitality of our current Christian Ed. program is largely do to the time and care put into it by our present director. To best serve the sessions intention for this committee, we felt the need to go beyond just a single recommendation

and offer other workable alternatives. We submit that responsibilities could be reassigned between staff members and committees to provide Christian Ed. leadership in the absence of a full time director. Alternatives for a part time Christian Ed. director and/or part time youth leader were discussed. To help guide session's discussion on this subject, a list of advantages/disadvantages and areas of concerns for these alternatives follows. Also included in appendix D is Browncroft Community Church's job descriptions for Director of Christian Education and for Director of Youth Ministries.

The option of eliminating the Christian Ed. director position completely was also discussed with the committee's conclusion that the function of program director would still be a requirement the remaining staff must provide. Whether the time exists in current staff schedules to support this function can only be addressed by the staff. Our committee's perception is that the current staff would be hard pressed to provide effective Christian Ed. leadership along with their current responsibilities.

Note that this option would help address one area of concern in our existing program mentioned earlier. Current Jr./Sr. High team members have voiced support for this option.

In summary, our task force committee concludes that our current Christian Ed. mission goals and resulting program recommendations would be effectively supported by a full time Christian Ed. director. A part time director is also a viable option if remaining staff are able to supplement program support. This also allows the option of hiring a part time youth leader if finances exist.

Our committee would like to thank session for its concern for the Christian Ed. program through initiating this task force. We believe the time was well spent in addressing your charge to us. During our meetings, numerous ideas for both program and structure were discussed which will be passed on to appropriate committees.

Whereas, the mortgagee has now agreed to a modification and extension of the said mortgage on certain terms and conditions specified in its letter of commitment dated November 2, 1987, all of which terms and conditions appear satisfactory to the Church, it is

Resolved: that Parkminster Presbyterian Church of Rochester accept and approve the terms and conditions proposed by Monroe Savings Bank, FSB, for the modification and extension of the existing mortgage covering its property in the Town of Chili, New York and agree that it will pay the balance thereof, being approximately \$1,032,000, together with interest on the unpaid balance thereof at any time owing at a rate established as 1% above the prime rate set by Monroe Savings Bank, FSB, but not greater than 12% per annum, in equal monthly installments of \$11,100.00 each, to be applied first to interest and the remainder thereof to principal for a maximum term of sixty months, after which time the entire balance thereof shall be all due and payable, and it is further

Resolved: that the appropriate officers of this Board and of the Church, and particularly the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and the Church Treasurer, be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute all necessary or appropriate papers and documents, including a Petition to the Supreme Court for leave to mortgage the said property, a mortgage modification and extension agreement and, if necessary, a request for approval hereof to the Presbytery of the Genesee Valley to implement foregoing resolution and to pay the expenses thereof.

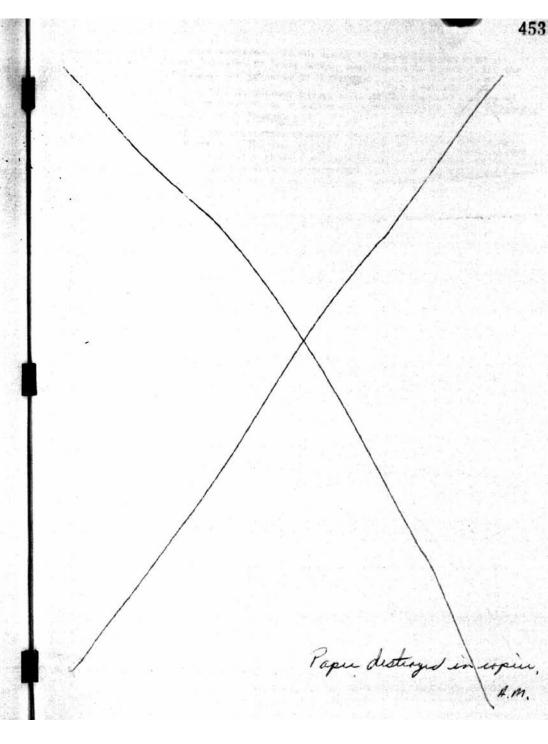

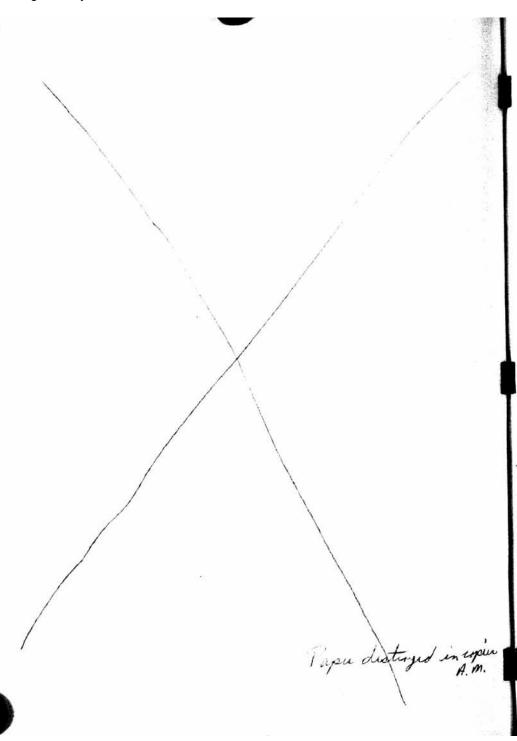

Visit by Thurlings - Bob shared his concern about the sense of direction taken as a church in recent years. Twenty years ago there was a campaign called DISC (Dimensions In Stewardship Commitment) which focused on program. Session and church leaders established a program based on vision regardless of cost. That vision was communicated through an every-member canvass with a cost estimate. Bob feels there is no vision or challenge in the present budget.

Bob also shared that he felt the decision to decrease from two services to one was detrimental to the church, that one service does not meet the needs of the people and does not encourage adults to attend Sunday School. In the past, money left at the end of the year was given to mission; therefore, he questioned the goal to have \$10,000 at the end of the year. Bob summarized by saying we have no where to go but up, we need to get behind a program and challenge people.

Jan shared her personal feelings about the church over recent months and challenged us with, "We have so much, we have to be able to look beyond ourselves and see the needs beyond us."

Trustee Chairperson Jean Leyland introduced Jim Harrison to review the 1989 budget, expressing thanks for the many hours of work he had put into it. of Jack Cleveland. Paid staff were excused from the meeting during discussion of salaries. The terms of call for the pastors will be discussed and voted upon during the meeting of the Corporation.

Nominating Committee Chairperson George Evans placed the following names in nomination for Elders, Class of 1991: Candice Garnham, Charles Brower, Munroe Kuhlkin, Edward Morse, Cindy Nichols, Alternate Robert Newman. Hearing no further nominations from the floor, it was <u>moved</u>, seconded and <u>carried</u> that the nominations be closed and the clerk cast one ballot to elect the slate as presented.

Each elder nominee was given an opportunity to share why he/she felt called to serve in this way.

Evans then placed the following names in nomination for Deacons, Class of 1991: Doris Barrows, William Christopher, Thomas Ellinwood, Nancy Fitch, and Mary Jackson. Also, the name of Peter Crandall was placed in nomination for the Class of 1989 to replace Donna Hilton who has found it necessary to resign from the Board. Hearing no nominations from the floor, it was moved, seconded and carried that the nominations be closed and the clerk cast one ballot to elect the slate as presented.

Since the position of Alternate Deacon was still open, nominations were received from the floor. Michael Kuhlkin and Farress Crombe were nominated. It was moved, seconded and passed to close the nominations. There was discussion regarding the advantages of having a youth serve as Deacon and the possible scope of responsibilities for such a person. The committee chairpersons were presented at this time. It was noted that chairpersons are still needed for Church in Society and Hospitality and Good News. The Corporation Chairperson asked the ministers to leave so discussion could follow on: Terms of Call for the Pastors. The members of the congregation discussed lack of salary increase. The Committee on Ministry Chairperson

plus a Trustee Elder spoke to the issue of financial package for ministers. Committee on Ministry Chairperson James Quinn spoke to the congregation saying that the church is experiencing hard times financially. A great deal of soul searching and prayer for God's direction took place over the Terms of Call and while the package is not ideal all parties are willing to work with it. Both ministers are willing and feel called to serve here during these lean times. A motion was moved, seconded and carried to accept the Terms of Call as presented.

It was suggested that during the year as people felt financially able, to think about the needs of the church, sacrifices made and programs trimmed to consider giving an additional amount of money for these needs.

An ammendment to the motion was: increase \$5,000 to \$8,500 to include \$3,500 of bequest monies freed up for operating fund usage. Seconded and discussion followed. After lengthy discussion the motion was withdrawn and seconder agrees. The congregation expressed faith in the Trustees for working on future financial concerns.

New Business; Carl Schultz asked about the status of a Capitol funds dirve and a Membership drive. Trustee-Elder Chairperson Jean Leyland noted that Session is addressing these concerns and will report back to the congregation. No further new business.

It instructs us concerning what we are to believe and how we are to behave. We pledge to submit to it as we endeavor to lead God's people. We embrace the witness of the Westminster Confession of Faith regarding the Holy Scripture (THE BOOK OF CONFESSIONS, 6.001-6.010.)

We affirm our commitment to the position that the life, ministry, worship and governing policies of this church have been established and will be maintained in accordance with the Bible, the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit, and The Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

The Session recognizes its responsibility to further the peace, purity, and unity of the church. We will attempt to be alert to any influences that originate from other religious, social or political groups with which members of this congregation are affiliated. All members will be asked to support the positions and policies of this church and to promote the health and spiritual life of this congregation to the honor and glory of God.

It was further <u>moved</u> by Preston and seconded to accept the suggested Bibliography Concerning the Community of Jesus to be made available to the congregation. Passed.

The Worship and Music committee has studied The Directory for Worship to determine what is mandated, recommended, common practice and/or permissible. The Directory for Worship outlines appropriate forms of worship. setting the norm and standards for the conduct of worship in The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The Directory discussed several appropriate symbols of response that are used in worship. These range from clapping to silence.

The following conclusions of the W & M committee have been reviewed. discussed and accepted by session.

- 1. Recognize that we have a wide spectrum of preferences for forms of
- 2. Come to the recognition that we have many varied opinions as to what is appropriate in worship, and each strive towards respecting those whose opinions may vary from our own.
- 3. Recognize the importance of maintaining reverence in worship.
- 4. Have balance in our worship that includes both traditional and contemporary
- 5. Recognize that music in worship is not to be for entertainment or artistic display, and that clapping should not be used to applaud the music as though it were a performance.

It was moved by Harrison and seconded that we hold an informational meeting for the congregation following worship on June 11 to discuss the Community of Jesus and the Worship and Music statement. Passed.

Other items discussed at the congregational meeting in November, particularly Burnham and attitudinal problems, will be addressed by Session and brought to the congregation at another time, but as quickly as possible.

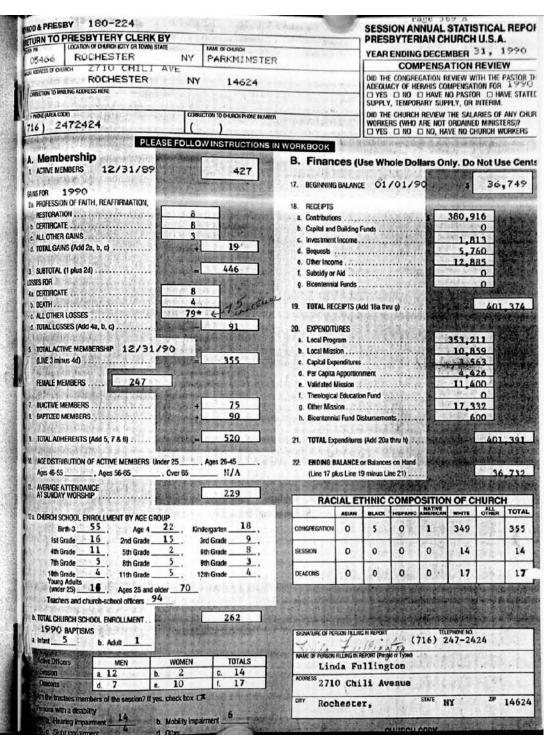

and that the sub-committee bring recommendations for session approval prior to the 1/19/92 meeting. Motion carried.

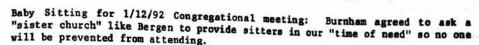

Organ Committee

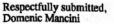

-- monitor speakers in the pulpit area.

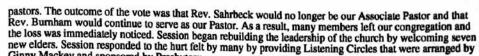

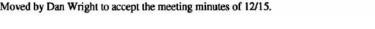

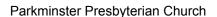

# BY-LAWS OF PARKMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

#### ARTICLE I.

#### Relationship

As a congregation of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), we hereby declare our acceptance of: The government, directory of worship and rules of discipline, as set forth in the Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and New York State civil law as it applies to religious organizations.

#### ARTICLE II.

#### Officers

The officers of the congregation shall be subordinate to the Session (consisting of not less than 9 nor more than 15 elders in multiples of three) per the constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and shall be as follows: a corporation chairperson and alternate, to be trustees or trustee/elders; a corporation clerk and alternate; a financial secretary and alternate; a treasurer and alternate; a board of Trustees, consisting of three members changeable in multiples of three at the annual corporation meeting or special congregational meeting called for that purpose, who may or may not be Elders of the church; a board of Deacons, consisting of not less than 9 nor more than 18 members.

#### ARTICLE III.

### Trustee Duties / Powers

The trustees are to be nominated by the nominating committee and elected at the annual congregational meeting or any other congregational meeting called for that expressed purpose. The powers and terms of office of the trustee board are set forth in the Book of Order. Any duties added to the responsibilities of the board of Trustees may be added only by specific action of the Session, and must comply with the Book of Order and New York State civic law as applied to religious organizations.

Duties added to Trustee responsibilities are:

- 1) Shall audit all bills against the congregation, and authorize their payment by the treasurer, and shall authorize no expenditure for any purpose not included in the budget as adopted by the Session, for a sum in excess of \$1,500.00 without authorization of the session.
- 2) Shall execute session approved tenant agreements.
- 3) Shall supervise the work of the Financial Secretary, Corporation Treasurer, Corporate Clerk, Sexton and

other volunteers involved in the care and upkeep of the building and grounds.

# ARTICLE IV.

# **Duties of Officers**

The clerk shall keep correct minutes of the proceedings at all business meetings of the Congregation, and shall record the same in a suitable book provided for such purpose and see that meetings of Congregation are persons elected to office by the Congregation, and furnish them with a copy of the minutes of any action of the Congregation affecting the administration of their duties.

The Financial Secretary -

(a) Shall, at the close of each service, record the offerings;

(b) Shall record any other funds belonging to the Congregation;

(c) Shall keep a record of all receipts and render statements annually to all members of the Congregation, and quarterly to those members in arrears.

(d) Shall supply all members and others who wish to contribute with weekly offering envelopes;

(e) Shall immediately turn over to the Treasurer all funds received, and take a receipt from the Treasurer for the same.

The Treasurer shall be custodian of all moneys belonging to the Congregation, and shall insure their deposit in such bank as directed by the Session which accounts shall be subject to checks signed by the Treasurer or in his absence the alternate, or the Corporate Chairperson or Alternate and such other officer as is authorized by the Board of Trustees.

# ARTICLE V.

#### Committees

The Congregation shall elect an auditing committee of 3 or more members of the Congregation, whose duty it shall be to examine the records, papers and books of the Treasurer and Treasurers of all Church committees, and to report upon the condition and accuracy of the same to the board of Trustees and the Session annually. Also, a report of the Auditing Committee activities and findings will be submitted for publication in the annual report.

# ARTICLE VI.

These By-Laws shall supersede and revoke all former By-Laws or Constitution of the Congregation.

#### ARTICLE VII.

#### Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of members present at any annual meeting or at any special Congregational meeting, provided notice of such proposed amendment has been given in the announcement of such meeting.

Music and Worship

During the past year, our services of worship have continued to be characterized by a trend which began in the latter part of 1992, the keynote of which is diversity. In the area of music and drama, as well as in other forms of the creative expressions of our faith, we have been led into new paths of worship and inspiration, while preserving the dignity of the more traditional service.

The musical content of our service represents a wide variety of styles and media, allowing for differences in background and taste within a diverse congregation. In order to provide for maximum participation on the part of guest artists from such sources as the Rochester Philharmonic, the Eastman School of Music, and our own music school staff, as well as by vocalists and instrumentalists within the church membership, a dual track system has been initiated. The prelude spot, which formerly consisted only of organ solos, is customarily available for other instrumentalists, allowing for more variety and flexibility. Anthems and offertories continue to be scheduled in advance. The system permits both short and long range planning suitable to the schedules and capabilities of those involved.

Essential to the establishment of a good music program in the church is the discovery and development of gifts within the Body among all age groups. This has been a primary focus of our operations during the past year. Part of our plan is to continue this process, as well as to encourage participation by guest musicians and to provide a place of welcome for them within our church family. We are grateful for the devoted ministry of Becky Davis in this area, as well s for her expert training and direction of the church's orchestra.

Also to be commended are Dave Beinetti and those serving with him in the praise group, whose faithfulness and dedication, along with that of the choir, give added life to the spirit of worship on Sunday mornings. Another new venture has been the bimonthly Sunday evening praise service led by Becky Davis and a corps of instrumental musicians.

Highlights of the year include the Holy Week services, particularly the Good Friday offerings of music in the classical tradition provided by a team of gifted instrumentalists. Of particular note during the fall was the Stained Glass concert by the RPO, consisting of an all Mozart program, held in our sanctuary.

As this is written, preparations are under way for the Christmas Eve service, under the capable direction of Wendy Burnham, which will incorporate a variety of talents within the church family, including music, drama and dance.

- On May I we had a service auction which was a "fun" time for all who attended. We raised \$2637.75 for Outreach.



 We sponsored Janet and Ernie Balajthy's plan to go to the Rift Valley Academy in Kenya for four months by having special offerings and by a special lunch after church on June 6.

· For a fund-raising activity, we had a bake sale during the three days of the rummage sale. \$505.85 came

from this activity.

- We had a bake and craft sale on October 22 while the flu clinic was going on in the social hall. This
  brought us \$100.00.
- We had another bake and craft sale on November 2 during election day. \$361.00 came from this.
- We sponsored Christmas gift giving for the Open Door Mission and Cephas Attica.
- · We were involved in the Flower City Work Camp.

In addition to the above, there were ongoing activities throughout the year. These included updating the display cabinet in the narthex and the large bulletin board downstairs, updating the Prayer Vigil twice a month, and corresponding with missionaries.

This year, the committee has spent a lot of time discussing and praying about the future of the preschool, and the connection to our church. We met with the session in October to discuss this. The session and the committee feel that the preschool needs to continue to be the excellent school that it is, while sharpening its focus on supporting the mission of the church. As we consider our role in bringing Christ to the 84 preschoolers and their families, we see great potential for ministry. Parkminster Preschool has a long tradition of being a light in the community, as both staff and committee model Christ's love and care to children and their families. Currently we are actively seeking other opportunities for ministry to the needs of these preschool families. For example, in September of this Year we put up a bulletin board that is continuously being updated to welcome families to church programs.

The preschool will see a big turn-around in committee members in the 94-95 school year. This has caused some concern as we seek to ensure continuation of the past quality of the preschool. #### Session

Session started the year by creating a strategic plan for the future of Parkminster Presbyterian Church, and using that plan to make a budget that would support Parkminster's future growth. ### The Twelve Keys to an Effective Church

To create the strategic plan, Steve Boggs led us through a study of the book, *The Twelve Keys to an Effective Church* by Kenneth L. Callahan. Callahan researched hundreds of churches, and has documented twelve characteristics that are common to successful churches. We used these principles to select four objectives for making Parkminster more effective. These are: a strong Sunday School program for adults and children, corporate, dynamic worship services with music support and drama, a program of visitation of members and those in the community, and significant relational groups.

Session invited Jack Harshbarger and Jim Moore of Pro-Monroe to present the Pro-Monroe complement to Total Quality Management. Mr. Harshbarger builds upon biblical principles, to describe a servant leadership that requires the leaders to release control of the work and the workers, and to trust the workers as they take ownership of the organization.

Jim Moore provided his consulting services and led us through a process called the Kepner Treague Decision Making Matrix. The strategy we developed in our study of the Twelve Keys to an Effective Church helped us to create a prioritized list of the church's objectives. The top priority items on this list reflect the four objectives listed above, plus two additional items: to carryout our mission (purpose), and to pay a fair wage to our staff. This list, and the decision making matrix, were used to evaluate budget proposals.

#### The 1993 Budget

The budget included some expense reductions, some increased expenses, and some areas of increased income. We did not pay our per capita assessment, other than the designated contributions made in the "Initial"

Offering" envelopes. Although it is important to support our church government, it is not mandatory that we pay the per capita. A second item of expense reduction was the postponement of payment on loans from members of the congregation. Each of the lenders has agreed to wait another year before receiving an installment in the repayment of their loan.

The pastor's salary package was increased by \$626 to cover a Presbytery-mandated increase in pension and major medical payments. Also, \$2500 was budgeted to pay for a sexton to do 15 hours per week of cleaning. We received some increased pledges, rented the manse at #8 Cardinal Drive at \$800 per month (\$5,600 in 1993), and rented portions of our building for a total of \$1,000 per month. The Italian Christian Fellowship rented our chapel facilities, and we entered a three year contract with the Servants of Christ Church for nonexclusive use of our facilities, primarily the East Hall and two Sunday School rooms.

# **Building and Grounds Maintenance Highlights**

During the month of September, Parkminster rallied its resources to renovate the East Hall, making it a comfortable new home for the Servants of Christ Church. In October, the parking lot was patched, sealed and striped. For further details, see the Trustees Report.

#### Bicameral System of Government

In the spirit of streamlining our organization, and encouraging ownership in Parkminster by its membership, session decided to switch to a bicameral form of government. A bicameral system divides the office of elder from the office of trustee. Under our unicameral system all of our trustees were also elders. Under the new system, anyone can be nominated for a trustee position which entails managing the church finances, making improvements and repairs to the church building and grounds, and maintaining the relationships with our renters.

God was gracious to us in 1993. Who would have ever imagined that all this could have happened? May God be glorified as we strive to become a church living in complete obedience to His will for us.

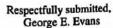
### Trustees

If you are a senior higher and want to be involved with an outreach to your friends so that they would know

Jesus, you could come to Young Life club on Monday nights. Kids from Gates-Chili, Churchville-Chili, Wheatland-Chili, Greece Odyssey, and numerous private schools in the area come together for a forty five minute club meeting complete with singing, crazy skits, and an informal talk about Jesus and His relevancy to your life. 75 kids have been known to show up for a Monday night meeting, and several kids tell me it's the

If crazy skits and crowds aren't your bag and you're looking for some serious Bible study time, then Senior High Fellowship, also known as Campaigners, is something you should check out. A study of Mark has been offered throughout the fall, and we have tackled discussions that vary from abstinence to making our fellowship group a comfortable, friendly, loving place to be. Once a month we play together at activities such as bowling, scavenger hunts, and pool parties. Meetings continue to be held at different kids homes at 7:00 on

Our senior highs don't just play together or fellowship together. They also serve through two important ministries during the year. Over ten kids participated in Flower City Work Camp this Spring, repairing and cleaning homes of people that live in the inner-city of Rochester. This experience is especially meaningful to our high schoolers, as is Summer's Best Two Weeks. 19 of our youth gave two weeks of their Summer to assist the traveling team of college-age adults spread the good news of Jesus Christ to elementary and middle school age children. The church was the center of activity, and our young people made it all the more wonderful through their giving spirits and loving hearts. The kids have also been called on to help people in need throughout the year and have responded with servant-like attitudes.

But what if you aren't old enough for Senior Highs? Don't worry-a brand new Middle School fellowship has been organized. Through the committed prayers of parents who have kids in this age group, a new group was organized this fall. The middle schoolers meet every other Friday night from 7:00-8:30. Non stop action abounds at this time, and refreshments are served after. A Bible study meets on the off Thursdays at the church, and small discipleship groups are in the process of being organized. Kids and their friends are invited to attend, and 35 kids have been at our meetings.

We know that meaningful ministry can also take place away from home, and we have had top notch trips throughout the year. Last winter the senior highs went to Lake Champion for a Young Life weekend. 23 kids also traveled to Saranac Village in the Adirondacks for a week of Young Life camping. Our Middle Schoolers traveled to Punky Hollow for a retreat in August, and our Campaigner group returned to Saranac in October for a weekend getaway. Profound ministry took place during these times, and it was a blessing to watch God move and work with our young people.

Sunday School continues to flourish. New kids from our Young Life group have begun to attend, and we have felt God moving in our midst. Senior Highs are meeting in the manse living room to make room for the growing numbers in the Middle School class. They have been studying Romans this fall. The Middle Schoolers have their own class again this year, under the leadership of Dave Beinetti.

So how does all this happen? It is through your prayers, your commitment to me as a staff member of our church, and the hundreds of hours that the volunteers put in so that kids would know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. The commitment of time that Tracy Laverack, Cori Williams, Matt Odmark, Greg Harp, Karen Rickus and Linda Rabjohn have given to this ministry is more than I could hope for. These people work full time or are full time students and give tirelessly of their time and energy, sometimes as much as 20 hours a week. I am blessed to work with such caring, giving people.

The year has been rich and exciting, and I have only begun to tell you everything I have seen God doing. Cornerstone, the manse at 10 Cardinal Drive, has been a blessing for me and the others living there. We are striving to learn to live together as men of God, and I have a sense of family from these brothers that makes the ministry of a Discipleship house more of a joy than a burden to my already busy life.

In closing, I would encourage you again this year to believe that God is moving in our midst, to claim the promises He makes for us both personally and for this, our church. Thank you for the privilege to serve you in this ministry. God bless you in the new year.

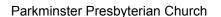

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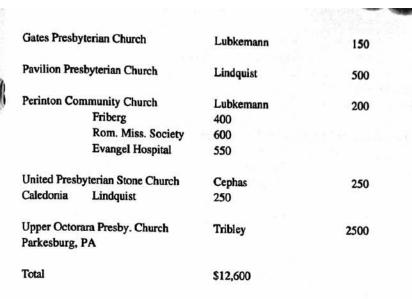

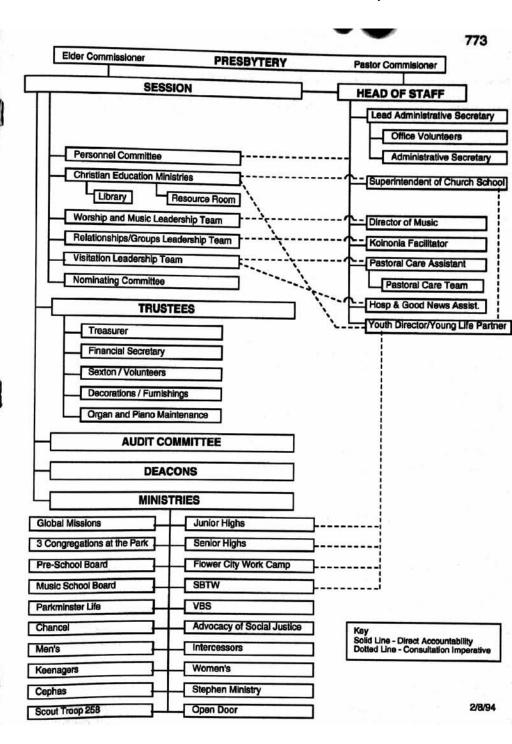

Staff Present:

 Paul and Jan would like to operate a Marriage and Family Counseling Office based at Parkminster. In exchange for office space they will offer Parkminster the following:

- 1) They will lead a Couple's Enrichment experience for Parkminster married couples. This program will last for 9 months. Approximately six times, couples will meet at Parkminster for a brief talk on the topic of nourishing their marriage relationship. 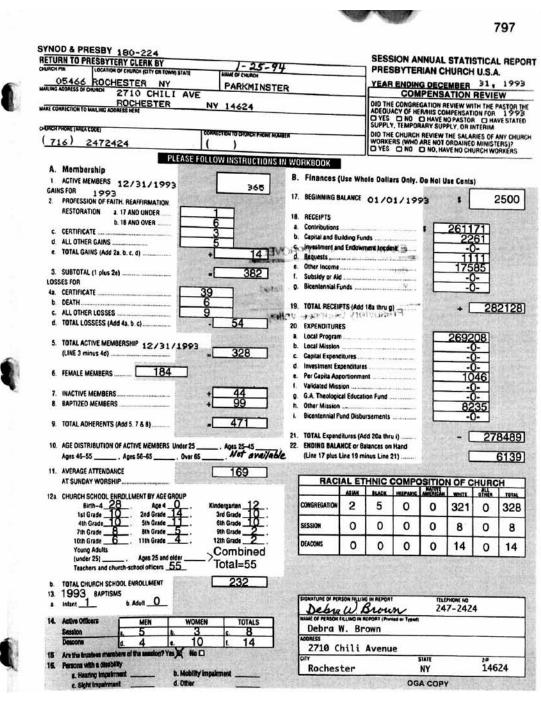
