
It'S HEARTWARMING TO LOOK AT THE ROOTS OF OUR PAST AND WHAT MAKES OUR CHURCH A GREAT FLACE TO BE TODAY, but we also need to look toward the future and see what we can do in the generations to come. Until about two years ago, our small, but strong congregation had been unable to reduce our mortgage debt, and still provide for the basic ministry of the church. Our leadership wisely decided to obtain some concessions on our mortgage principal payments from the bank so the basic ministry of the church could continue. Now that God has brought us through those difficult financial times, we feel that the Lord is calling us to a greater goal that will help us to better serve our community. This goal is to reduce our mortgage debt. A reduction in our debt will enable us to lower our monthly operating costs and expand our ministries.

WE ARE ASKING FOR YOUR PARTICIPATION, AND HOPE, as you make your commitment of financial support to help reduce our mortgage debt, that you will prayerfully consider with joy and thanksgiving all of the blessings that God has given you.

REACHING OUR GOAL

THE BENEFITS OF A SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN The morgage reduction campaign will have measurable and immeasurable benefits. In reaching our goal, our church family will enjoy the following benefits:

Our goal is an ambitions one, but with

God's faithfulness and your support, we can

make it happen together as a community.

Our goal is to reduce our mortgage balance

to \$500,000 or less in three years. To do

this, we have engaged in a three-phase

campaign that began with church leaders

(Session, Deacons, and Trustees) that

*Reduce the church mortgage principal by one-third, to \$500,000

*Reduce mortgage payments, from 35% to less than 20% of our annual operating budget

*Free up \$20,000 or more per year in operating budget

All this will be possible by combining our mortgage reduction campaign with refinancing of the church building mortgage at a lower interest rate than we are currently paying. Contributions of more than \$50,000 were received during the 1998 church leadership giving. These contributions were used to reduce the mortgage principal in 1998 from \$752,000 to \$697,000. Currently, the terms of our anticipated new mortgage include a sliding interest rate scale. As we reduce the outstanding balance on the mortgage principal, the interest rate is also reduced until we reach an outstanding balance of \$500,000 when the interest rate will be fixed at 7.9%. This provides additional incentive for us to reduce our church mortgage principal in the most expeditious way possible.

How we can better use the DOLLARS we ONE The financial benefits of a successful campaign will also provide tangible benefits to Parkminster's ministry. As we make progress towards the mortgage reduction

goal of \$250,000, savings in the operating budget will grow to \$20,000 or more per year. This gives us the opportunity to redirect these funds to current and new ministries. The Session has identified the following areas of ministry:





MORTGAGE REDUCTION CAMPAIGN DETAILS Phase 1, started during 1998, reached 95% of its goal of \$130,000 through a combination of the 1999 principal payment from the operating budget, offerings designated for mortgage reduction, and leadership giving pledges of \$87,000. Phase II includes the 2000 principal payment from the operating budget and seeks to raise \$62,000 in gifts and pledges from the congregation. Phase III includes the 2001 principal payment from the operating budget and seeks to raise \$21,000 from former members and friends.



NOTE: Figures shown are weekly additional giving calculated over a three year period.


Our goal is highlighted.
