A brief history of the first Methodist Episcopacy Church in Penfield N.Y.

Some time during the first decade of the present century a society of Methodists was organized about one mile north from the present location of this Church (the precise time is not known in what was then known as the "Town of Northfield" embracing territory that now constitutes the Towns of Penfield Webster and part of Princeton.

About the year 1806 our own venerable father Rev S. S. Graves moved in from Lima and was appointed Leader of this Class and their place of meeting moved to what is now known as Penfield Center.

This is believed to have been the first religious organization in this section of country. The Baptist society was next organized at the east part of the village and a Presbyterian society about the same time was organized in a log house between this place and Pittsford - the parent society of the Presbyterian Churches in Penfield Pittsford and Webster.

In the summer of 1829 or '30 a society of Methodists was organized by Rev Phil. Hordworth then of Victor Ct at the house of James Chase the house is now standing on the hill a little south from the Penfield Mills.

This society at its organization consisted of the following named persons. John Dillman Leader - Mrs Lucy Ann Mrs Phoebe Chase, Mrs Phila. Hull, Mrs Sarah Barrett Mrs Lucy Williams & Mrs Lois Mann. These all except the last named who is still living - died in peace - they rest near their home and their work follows them.

Soon after its organization this society was turned over to the care of Rev Jonathan Huntis of blessed memory then Pastor in charge of Penfield Circuit and the place for meeting was changed to this village at the house of Jonathan Barrett after being driven from one private house to another for a length of time the society by the blessing of the Lord slowly increasing in numbers and we believe in places two found a stopping place for worship for about two years in what was denominately "the Old Penfield Store" then the charge during the pastoral labors of Rev Jonathan Benson purchased a portion of the "Globe Building" since purchased which stands opposite the Brick Church where for several years it continued to worship. Reducing its labors and slowly but certainly enlarging its borders until June 29th 1843 when it moved into the neat and comfortable Church that stood nearly on the ground occupied by the beautiful and magnificent Temple we today (July 17th 1870) dedicate to the service and worship of Almighty God. The former Church was dedicated by Rev Samuel Lusk D.D. Dec 22nd 1822.
