# Historical Society Completes Town Record Files

At a recent Executive Committee meeting of the Perinton Historical Society pians were made for the coming meeting to be held April 11 at 8:00 in the Legion Room in the Municipal Skivington George Building. Scottsville will be the speaker. The public is cordially invited to attend.

The important work done by the Perinton Historical Society is not generally known. Prominent in its recent activities has been the making of permanent records of the town's

early documents.

In 1939 a committee was formed to supervise a National Youth Administration indexing and copying project, sponsored by the Perinton Historical Society and the Town Board. April, the work began. The Town Board, using money from the Historian's Fund, purchased the materials used and granted space in the Municipal Building. The NYA provided from one to six girls who worked two days a week indexing, typing and filing. Their work was checked by the local committee.

Town documents from 1813-1890 were card indexed for name and subject matter and these are now on file in the Town Clerk's Office. Fifty-six thousand cards were used, filling 12

two-drawer filing units.

Perinton has cause to be proud of its early records. Many towns in Western New York -have lost theirs through accident or carelessness. Several interesting articles on early history have been typed, two very old tax rolls, the earliest town clerk's book, and a very early overseer's record, all were copied, thus making them available for use without danger to the original. It is hoped to copy other records as they are located.

1898 were indexed under the same NXA project. This was done in Rochester and has not been checked by the society. This index is on file in the Fairport Public Library, together with bound volumes of the papers.

The local NYA project closed April 10, 1941 and the local committee completed the task with the assistance of a typist paid from the Town Histor-

ian's Fund.

The Society hopes in time to build up a useful store of local reference material which will be available at all times to anyone interested in the early history of this community.
