Preliminary History.

At a meeting of the Lutheran League (now Lutheran Mission Union, City) held January 14, 1892, Rev. J. E. Whittaker, Pastor of the Church of the Reformation, Grove St., City, and Chairman of the Committee on Fields of the Lutheran League proposed that an English Lutheran mission be planted at or near the corner of St. Joseph and Clifford streets, City.

After careful consideration of the proposition a Sunday-school was started Sunday afternoon March 6th 1892 in Wideman Hall (now Magill's Block) corner of St. Joseph and German streets, this hall being most convenient for Sunday-school purposes.

Later on arrangements were made with the trustees of the German B. M. E. Church, corner Clifford and Loomis streets, to occupy their chapel each Sunday afternoon and once during the week, if desired.

August 1st of the same year the Sunday-school known as St. Paul's Mission comfortably settled in the roomy chapel, corner Clifford and Loomis streets.

Under the supervision of Rev. J. E. Whittaker the work developed rapidly and was carried on at no expense to the Lutheran League.

June 15, 1893 Mr. William J. Hinshelwood was elected Superintendent of St. Paul's Mission by action of the Board of Directors of the Lutheran League. He had been interested in the work from the beginning by acting as chorister and teacher.

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During July and August, 1893, Mr. Louis F. Mayle, a student of Wagner Mem. Luth. College, 4 to 8 Oregon St. City, was authorized by the Finance Committee of the Lutheran League to canvass the city, soliciting funds for the expenses of the League and advertising the real work of the League in order to awaken an interest among Lutherans in the extension of English Lutheran mission work ^{and especially in St. Paul's Mission.} Mr. Mayle realized \$200.00 for the League.

Oct. 15, 1893 a special harvest festival program was carried out. Circulars in German and English had been distributed among the people of the immediate neighborhood, inviting them to the service. At the appointed time the chapel was filled with visitors interested in the work.

Mr. L. C. F. Liddie, first teacher in the Concordia Parochial School and Mr. C. J. Wischurman made addresses in German, explaining the cause of St. Paul's Mission.

Rev. W. L. Hunter, Pastor of Grace Church, and Mr. J. F. Dinkley made addresses in English. Copies of the program and of the circular were filed in the archives of the congregation.

In 1894 preaching services were begun at the beginning of the Advent season. These services were held immediately after the Sunday-school session 4 o'clock P. M. and conducted by the English Lutheran Pastors of the city alternately. Owing to the time of service being unfavorable, the services were discontinued the following April 1895.

In September, 1895 the Lutheran League decided to permit the Teachers Association of St. Paul's Mission to supervise and develop the work under the directions of the Lutheran League the latter being responsible for all financial deficiencies.

At a regular meeting of the Trustees of the Lutheran League, held February 27, 1896 it was decided to canvass the field of St. Paul's Mission in order to learn the prospects of organizing a congregation. At the same meeting a call was extended to Mr. Louis F. Mayle, a student of theology in the Seminary at Fort Doug, Phila., Pa. to canvass the field during his summer vacation (June, July and August) under the direction of Rev. W. J. Miller. The call was accepted. Mr. Mayle confined his labors to the development of the mission work in St. Paul. During these three summer months the regular attendance at the mission averaged 230, or 130 more than during the summer months of the previous year. The collections averaged \$3.00 per Sunday. A special feature during these three months was the annual picnic held at Seneca Park. About 500 people were present and the work as a whole received a new impulse; new friends were gained and old ones became interested anew.

The year 1897 formed a ^{transitional} ~~historical~~ period in the history of the Paul's Mission. February 11, the Lutheran League received a communication from the German B. M. Church, giving notice the St. Paul's Mission must vacate the chapel within 30 days from Feb. 1, as the German B. M. Church decided to occupy the chapel exclusively.

At once a committee was appointed to negotiate with the German B. M. Church with a view of purchasing the Clifford St. property. This committee consisted of Messrs. E. J. Michman, J. Karmelich and J. M. Miller.

At the next meeting of the League this same committee submitted the

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following report.

To the Trustees of the Lutheran League.
Sentinels:

Your committee appointed at a regular meeting of this board held Dec. 11, 1897 for the purpose of negotiating with the Trustees of the Second Ser. M. Ch. Church, with a view of purchasing the Clifford Street property would respectfully report that the Clifford Street Chapel situated on the N. W. cor. of Clifford and Loomis streets with all its contents, with the exception of a new book case be purchased at our offer of \$3250.00, that the German Methodist people have the privilege of occupying the chapel for six months if necessary free of rent. That we pay them \$500.00 cash and \$12.50.00 in notes divided into three equal payments of \$416.66 each, the first to become due six months from date, the second 12 months and the third 18 months, all with interest.

This report of Feb. 25, 1897 was accepted and the committee empowered to negotiate for the purchase of the Clifford Street property in accordance with the report.

At a meeting of the League held March 4, 1897 the above committee reported "that the Second Ser. M. Ch. Church were not entirely satisfied with the arrangement adopted at the last meeting of the said trustees and our committee, but rather that it should be a spot cash transaction instead of negotiating notes, etc."

Finally the "spot cash" transaction was effected which resulted in giving the University of Rochester a mortgage of \$2500.00 on the Clifford St. Property.

The actual transfer of the property took place February 23, 1897. The German B. M. Church possessed the property from April 28, 1890. Previous to this date the property was held by the North Baptist Church (now at corner Whittier & Ave. A.

The most important step to be taken by the "Lutheran Mission Union" for the benefit of St. Paul's Mission was the calling of a regular pastor would organize and develop the mission into a congregation.

The Union considered this step a serious one from a financial point of view.

In order to give a correct record of the facts in this connection (of calling a pastor) the writer will insert the following formal communications which were exchanged before a pastor was formally secured.

Dear Mr. Mayle

The Lutheran Mission Union of Rochester N. Y. at a recent meeting took, in substance, the following action in regard to St. Paul's Mission:

"Resolved, that it is the sense of this body that the time has arrived when a missionary should be called to take charge of St. Paul's Mission.

Resolved, that we consider Mr. L. F. Mayle, now a student in the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Mt. Airy, the proper person to take charge of the field.

Resolved, that we would be very glad to see Mr. Mayle become the missionary of St. Paul's Mission.

Resolved, that we as the Lutheran Mission Union, in view of our financial condition and the responsibility resting upon us cannot now make or make ourselves responsible for any salary.

Resolved, that we lay this matter before Mr. Mayle and learn his opinion in regard to it."

We desire you to understand the

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situation. St. Paul's Mission needs a pastor. We think you are the man for this place, but as we have recently purchased the chapel and are still assisting Trinity Church, we are not able to make ourselves responsible for any salary now.

We would like you to think this matter over very carefully and prayerfully and let us know the conclusion you have arrived at.

You know the field and its possibilities, so we need say nothing in that line.

If you see your way clear to take charge of St. Paul's we will arrange to have a call extended to you by one of our churches.

Dear Friends and Coworkers in Christ: —

In your communication of the 15th, inst. you respectfully submitted various resolutions for careful and prayerful consideration, namely:

That the need of a pastor at St. Paul's Mission is imperative and that I am considered the proper person for this office; that you could not make

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yourself responsible for any stated salary, but that, if I see my way clear to take charge of the work, you would arrange with a congregation to extend a call to me; finally, that you lay these resolutions before me and learn my opinion concerning them.

Since I am simply requested to express my opinion on these resolutions, I shall try to confine myself to the privilege thus offered and, by so doing my desired opinion would aid you in deliberating on the very important matter confronting you at present, I would feel delighted to think that I also have contributed towards the work of Christ, which you are fostering in the northern part of your city.

To my mind the resolutions, first of all, call attention to the pleasant fact that the "Lutheran Mission Union" has not yet grown indifferent towards its first love, the love of continuing steadfastly in the Apostles' doctrine, not only by appropriating it for itself, but also by making the preaching of it possible to others. Surely, this is the Master's work and must at times be very trying because it requires so much self-denial for its extension. Many people cannot see the value of such work, nor enjoy the blessings which it bestows, for the simple reason, that they do not fall in line and do their part; and as the Psalmist says, because they do not taste and see, etc.

This is one factor which has hindered the work of your organization to a certain extent and this very factor again is making your present problem difficult for solution. Yet, in the face of various discouragements, you are determined to over-

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come the difficulties properly and effectively, because you are existing to accomplish such work as is mapped out in your constitution and because you feel in duty bound to foster the same to the extent of your ability. My opinion on this point is that you are doing the proper thing, not only for your own good, but also for the good of the church.

The financial question appears to be a difficult matter in your consideration respecting St. Paul's Mission. If that be true only in appearance, it is not for me to say that it is not true in reality. I do not know much about your financial ability, and I believe that I am not expected to state how much men of your position in life are actually able to contribute towards a cause, which stands exclusively for Christ and the church. That is a private matter and must be solved by each one as he purposes in his heart.

I will, therefore, state my opinion concerning the financial ability of the Mission only. The people in the mission field are generally the first to suffer in times of want and the last to recover in times of plenty. Yet, I positively learned that they are very willing to contribute according to their ability. They have manifested such willingness in a substantial way on several occasions and, ^{with} it not assured, continue in a like disposition when the work is once their own.

They truly believe that their spiritual and social welfare is determined by their position respecting the work evangelization.

St. Paul's Mission has not yet been burdensome to your organization. To my knowledge it is and has been self-sustaining. Although it has not been so from its beginning, it became so in a remarkably short time. If I am correctly informed

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last December, St. Paul's Mission not only meets its own current expenses, but also takes care of its own mortgage on the property. Hence I must conclude that whatever the mission as a transient Sunday-school accomplished, it, as an organized congregation, will and can accomplish in a much higher degree, namely, become self-sustaining in the course of a short time. The mission does not owe an apology for its existence; nevertheless, this mission must not be expected, that is, the mission cannot come to life of itself, but must be brought to the life through the medium of your organization. Being financially unable to be this instrumentality you very properly decided to arrange with a congregation for the realization of this work. This ought to be done, even if your finances enabled you to carry on the work independently. Although the work in the mission field must after all be done by the missionary in charge, it, nevertheless, ought to be under the supervision, responsibility and pastorage of a good church council. This would save the missionary the necessity of formally organizing the work before it becomes mature. Mission work cannot spring up like a mushroom, but must unfold and develop decently and in order according to I Cor. 14:40.

The orderly method prevailed in the past and as a result the rich blessings of God are manifestly and graciously resting on the work so far accomplished. Hence the work must be fostered in the future, so that the mission without hesitation may expect the favor of Christ and the church.

You have considered me the proper person to take charge of the work now before

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you and you desire to know, whether I
see my way clear to do so.

By taking such action you have
open a sphere of labor for which I have
been preparing the past seven (7) years.

That certainly encourages me very much
at the close of my preparatory course.

At the same time I am conscious of the
responsibilities, to a certain extent at
least, which such a position in the

Lord's vineyard essentially carries with it.

Therefore, my only prayer is to be made
truly sensible of such a divine charge which

is being committed to my care and
keeping. There is nothing to hinder me

from devoting my united efforts to the
cause. If the Lord will preserve me

as he so graciously has done, I will
see my way clear to take charge of the

work, if it be made possible for me to
do so, that is, if the call which you de-

clared to extend be regular and explicit, mak-

ing the approval of the church, so that the
work may be organized properly and de-

veloped effectually.

To my mind I have now after due
consideration sincerely expressed my request-

ed opinion on the resolutions submitted.
Trusting that you will receive the same

confidently and hoping to hear from you

Dear Mr. Mayle,

The Mission Union have received

your letter of February 21st and considered the same at their last meeting held March 8th inst.

After its reading there seemed to be some doubt in the minds of some of the members whether our financial circumstances were clearly understood by you as well as the basis on which the Mission Union entered into correspondence with you.

So it was directed to take up the subject further with you tending to a clearer understanding.

Our financial shape at present, does not justify our pledging any amount whatever, to the support of a Pastor for Clifford Street Mission. We intend that all moneys collected by the pastor, from St. Paul's Church and Sunday school and outside sources to toward the support of said church should go toward his compensation.

The Mission Union will continue to pay the interest on the mortgage, and when their condition warrants it, devote further sums towards to the work of the St. Paul's Mission.

If this is your understanding, then we are agreed, and it will afford us great pleasure to have the Church of the Reformation extend you a call at once, as asst Pastor in charge of St. Paul's Mission, the salary being whatever amount is collected from the St. Paul's Church and Sunday school over and above its expenses, excluding the interest on the mortgage which will be paid by the Mission Union and such other sum from outside sources you may collect for the support of said Church. Hoping this will meet with your favorable consideration and trusting that we may have a clearer understanding we will await, with much pleasure and anxiety, your speedy reply.

Having received the above the Mission Union sent the following communication to the Church Council of the Church of the Reformation asking the Council to extend a call to Mr. Mayle on the conditions specified.

At a special meeting of the Lutheran Mission Union of Rochester, N. Y. held in the Church of the Reformation March 23/98, at which meeting were present Rev W. J. Miller, J. F. Linkley, J. M. Miller, John Karwiesch, J. S. Kratz, F. C. Lauer, E. C. Margrauer, P. Schaefer, and W. J. Steinhilber, Mr. Schaefer offered the following which was unanimously adopted:

"Whereas - Notwithstanding the poverty of the Lutheran Mission Union, and our inability at present to provide for the regular support of a missionary, it is the unanimous sense of the Union, that a pastor should be placed in charge of St. Paul's Mission at the earliest possible date.

Whereas - Rev. L. F. Mayle is selected for the position, by reason of his experience in that field, and our belief that the work will grow successfully under his services,

Be it resolved - That we petition the Board of Trustees and Church Council of the Church of the Reformation to extend Rev. L. F. Mayle a formal call to become the Assistant Pastor of the Church of the Reformation; it being understood, that his whole duty shall be the oversight and development of St. Paul's Mission, subordinate to and under the direction of the Lutheran Mission Union, until such a time as a regular congregation be duly and permanently organized, ready by its officers to assume the direction thereof.

Resolved - The compensation shall be whatever sums can be secured from St. Paul's Mission, less the necessary expenses for maintenance and operation.

The Lutheran Mission Union will guarantee the interest on the mortgage, and whenever there are funds in hand avail

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able, may appropriate whatever amount may be necessary to give the assist. pastor a salary of \$500. ^{per annum} -

Resolved - That, this arrangement may be terminated any time upon three months written notice by either the assist. pastor, or the Lutheran Mission Union.

It is understood, and the Church of the Reformation Board & Trustees are assured, that neither they nor the Lutheran Mission Union will assume any liability for any salary, or portion of salary, by reason of this call.

Dear Brethren in Christ:—

After an experienced missionary society
like the Lutheran Mission Union has
formally confessed its financial inability
to organize and to develop the promising
and responsible work in St. Paul's Mission,
it has become a very serious problem
to my mind, whether an inexperienced
candidate for the ministry should
assume the responsibilities of such
an exceptionally promising field. I have
not yet been able to solve this problem,
for the simple reason, that I have invested
my all in a seven years course of pre-
paration for the office of the holy ministry
and at present have no collateral to offer
for any further financial aid. To assume

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the financial risk for St. Paul's Mission requires something of me, which I do not possess. Yet, to preach the Gospel and to administer the sacraments is a work which should not arbitrarily be determined by temporal means, which are only secondary, as we learn in the mission of the Twelve and also in that of the Seventy. After duly considering the temporal side of the call, which is ordinarily a matter of sight, has finally presented itself to me as a matter of faith.

My reply, therefore, is the following.

Although I am utterly unable to see my way clear with respect to finances, I, nevertheless, consider it my Christian duty to accept the call extended in accordance with the Lutheran Mission Union's minutes as a whole, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, in whose gracious help I trust.

If, because of my financial inability, my pastorate of St. Paul's Mission should not bring about the expected results of such a promising mission field, I trust that you will conscientiously avail yourselves of the opportunity provided for in the call referring to the termination of the arrangement between the assistant pastor and the Lutheran Mission Union.

Having been favorably advised by the President of Synod, I have decided to take charge of St. Paul's Mission Wednesday, June, the ~~twenty~~ ^{seventy} ninth (St. Paul's Day) eighteen hundred and ninety-eight.

Services

Preaching services were conducted evenings at 7.45 o'clock, beginning with July 10. No organization was effected at the beginning, the object being to give the people interested an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the Lutheran form of service, etc., and to become conscious of the responsibilities connected with the organization of a congregation.

The Sunday-school held regular sessions at 3.15 P. M. Much effective work was accomplished, although a number of the scholars and teachers were away on vacations. The annual picnic was held at Kantha Park city on the 24 of August. After arriving on the grounds an electric storm arose and raged till 3.30 o'clock P. M. The remainder of the day was cheerfully spent by all.

Organization of the congregation

After due announcement a meeting was called of all persons desiring to connect themselves with the church. The meeting was held at the church Sept. 7th 1898 at 8 o'clock p. m.

Seven persons after due discussion adopted a constitution and By-Laws. It was decided to elect officers the following Wednesday evening Sept. 14, 1898 and to complete the organization. It was further decided to permit proper persons to become charter members by signing the constitution before the election of officers took place. At this service the Pioneer Teachers Association of the Sunday-school presented the congregation with a handsome communion set. The presentation was made by the pioneer Supt. Mr. W. J. Steinhausen. The pastor Rev. L. F. Mayle, responded in behalf of the congregation and cordially invited the Teachers Association to commune with the congregation at its first administration of the Holy Communion the following Sunday Oct. 30. 1898 at the regular morning service.

The following unguarded statement appeared in the *WELCOME*, February 1902; Vol. 13, No 12:

"To the Lutheran Mission Union belongs the credit of establishing and sustaining the great work of English missions in Rochester. Without asking for any financial support from the home mission board, or receiving any material assistance outside of this city, its record of missionary activity is rarely paralleled. As the result of its heroic efforts, it can point with pride to three prosperous churches. It is a source of much gratification to announce that sufficient pledges have been received to cancel every dollar of indebtedness. We congratulate the Mission Union!"

The above statement being found contrary to facts in the case the following statement was issued in the September No. of the *WELCOME* 1902 by the president of the Lutheran Mission Union.

COMMUNICATION.

My attention has been called to a statement made in the *WELCOME* several months ago, giving the Lutheran Mission Union all credit for the establishment and maintenance of the English Lutheran missions in Rochester, and without its receiving any financial support from a mission board, or any material assistance from outside of the city.

Now, in so far as this refers to St. Paul's mission, strict truthfulness requires that a proper acknowledgment should be made of the self-sacrificing labors of Rev. F. L. Mayle, who began the regular pastoral work in this field on June 29, 1898, in response to the following call:

Whereas, Notwithstanding the poverty of the Lutheran Mission Union, and its inability at present to provide for the regular support of a missionary, it is the unanimous sense of the union, that a pastor should be placed in charge of St. Paul's mission at the earliest possible date.

Whereas, Rev. F. L. Mayle is selected for this position by reason of his experience in the field, and our belief that the work will grow successfully under his services.

WELCOME of February
of 1902

Be it Resolved, That we petition the Church of the Reformation to extend Rev. Mayle a formal call to become the assistant pastor of the Church of the Reformation, with the understanding that his whole duty shall be the oversight and development of St. Paul's mission, subordinate to and under the direction of the Lutheran Mission Union, until such time as a regular congregation is duly and permanently organized, ready by its officers to assume the duties thereof.

Resolved, That the compensation shall be whatever sums can be secured from St. Paul's mission, less the necessary expenses for the maintenance and operation. The Lutheran Mission Union will guarantee the interest on the mortgage, and whenever there are funds in hand available, may appropriate whatever amount may be necessary to give the assistant pastor a salary of \$600 per annum. It is understood, and the Church of the Reformation is assured, that neither it, nor the Mission Union will assume any liability for any salary, or portion of salary, by reason of this call.

Resolved, That this arrangement may be terminated at any time upon three months' written notice, by either the assistant pastor, or the Lutheran Mission Union.

Without receiving any compensation from the union, Rev. Mayle so successfully prosecuted the work in this field, that, on September 14, 1898, St. Paul's church was regularly organized, and through its church council assumed the payment of the interest on the mortgage. On March 28, 1899, the Lutheran Mission

Union gave them a deed for the property.

It is also just to note at this time, that Rev. Mayle, during three summer vacations of his student years, prior to 1898, served the Mission Union in the preliminary work of this field eight months, for which he was paid \$150. * *see below*.
