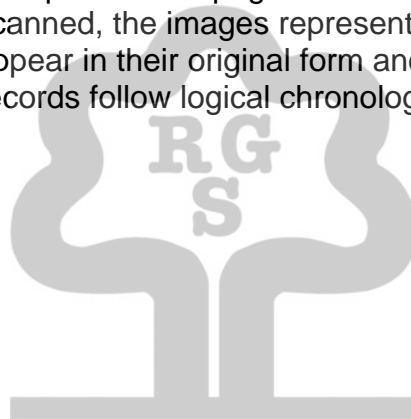

Dr. Johnston goes tonight to Chicago to attend the Jubilee Meeting of the Foreign Missions Council of North America, in his official capacity as President of the Board of Foreign Missions, Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. He will preside tomorrow at McCormick Seminary over a special seminar on the "Christian World Mission". He has multiple responsibilities in connection with the meetings which run through the week. He will return to Rochester on Tuesday morning, January 11th.

"Departmental" group worship, singing, and promotion have not been possible above the Primary. To release the children earlier from the service in the sanctuary—as this new form allows—will enable us to rebuild a community experience at each age-group level. We are sure that our parents will be glad to see this happen, and will welcome our overcoming in this manner what has proven to be a serious lack in our general educational program.

### THE EASTERN ORTHODOX CHURCH

With the restoration of the Russian Church to its rightful liberties, there has been an enormous new interest in its history and its manners of practice and liturgy. Of course the Eastern Orthodox Church is not confined to Russia. It is one of the oldest of the Christian Churches. James, the Apostle, formulated the liturgy upon which Basil and Chrysostom erected the order of worship in the fourth century.

There are three services each week in which the entire life of Christ is celebrated: the eve service, the dawn service, and the divine liturgy. This is another—worldly type of religion, and, in common with most religions of the East, is very symbolic and mystical.

The Lord's Prayer, always chanted, is taken this morning from the Ukrainian Office. The Cherubim Song always precedes the Communion Service proper, when the priest offers up the gifts of the people.

## On the Life of Dr. Charles Russel Barber

Dr. Charles Russel Barber was born December 30, 1855 at Wyoming, New York, just forty miles southwest of Rochester. He was graduated from Middlebury Academy in 1875, from the University of Rochester in 1879; his medical course was taken at the College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York and the University of Buffalo, where he graduated in 1882.

He married Merron I. McConnell, a member of an old Rochester family. They settled in Rochester where he engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery, founding the Park Avenue Hospital in 1907. He was closely identified all his life with the County Medical Department and was a member of the Executive Committee which set up medical plans and organized the staff of the new County Hospital.

Also he was Vice President of the Board of Iola Sanitarium and was very interested and active in tuberculosis work. For many years he was a member of the Board of Elders of Memorial Presbyterian Church and for 17 years was Superintendent of its Sunday School, his wife at the same time teaching a class of 40 young women. In 1912 the family joined the Third Presbyterian Church and in 1914, during Dr. Strayer's pastorate, he was made an Elder.

In his later years, he was hard of hearing and to be sure he did not miss the sermons, he had a special acousticon installed in his seat in the Church.

He died on April 5, 1935, at the age of 79.

Mrs. Waldo G. Wildes (Ruth Barber) is the donor of this modern and efficient acousticon system which now replaces our old and outmoded set. In its weekly service to the hard-of-hearing, it will perpetuate the honored memory of her father, Dr. Charles Russel Barber, who worshipped in this same Church with devout regularity. Two other daughters, Mrs. David C. Naramore and Mrs. Neil McMillan, Jr., also are members of Third Church.

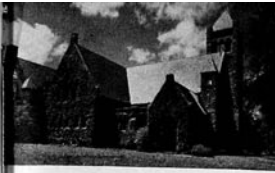

"There is no other Book of Praise so pregnant with expression of the heart's emotions under all the vicissitudes of life, or so adapted to all climes and ages as to be the universal medium of praise for all nations of the world. No country but Palestine, varying as it does from the arid desert to the mountains capped with snow, could have furnished such a combination of subjects for poetical imagery: its vines and fruits; its valleys thick with corn and shining with lilies; its mountains, torrents, rivers, lakes; its wild and domestic animals, and its beasts of prey,—all are pictured in the Psalms with a noble simplicity to which we find no parallel elsewhere." ### Soldiers' Christmas Greeting

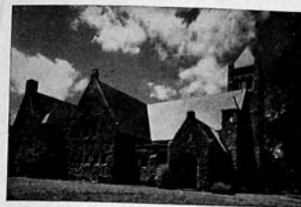

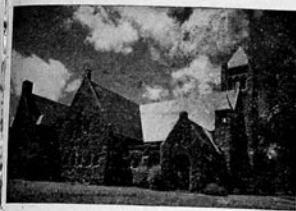

### Writers Are Wanted

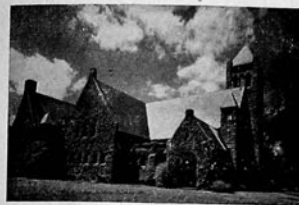

At that time he transferred his affection and loyalty from the Salem Evangelical Church, where he had served for twenty-five years as Church Organist, to this Church. In 1939 he was elected an Elder and his wide experience as musician and churchman was turned to our benefit. As chairman of the Music Committee, he gave unlimited time, conscientious effort, and able counsel to those who, with him, directed the service of sacred music in our Church.

#### *Kenneth W. Paul*

For more than ten years, Kenneth W. Paul was a member of this Church and a faithful attendant at its services of worship. The practice of weekly worship in God's House was just one of the marks of his fine character. A graduate of the University of Rochester and Harvard Business College, he was a young man of high ideals, fine ability, unusual musical talent, and true Christian habits. He was one of the first members of the Service Board which was reorganized by Dr. Johnston and through this medium and others rendered devoted and capable service to his Church.

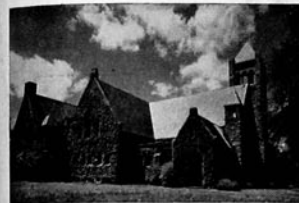

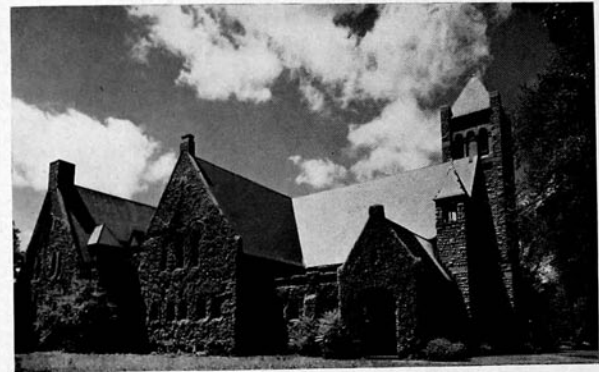

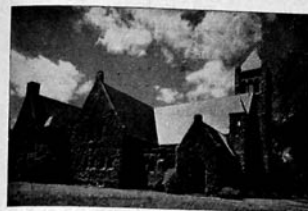
