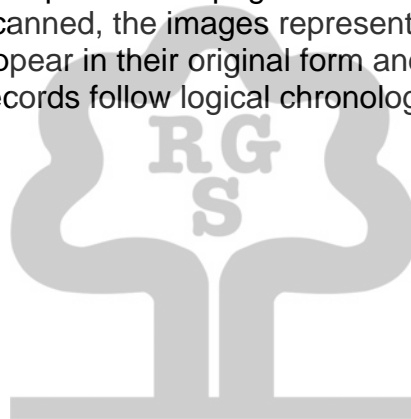

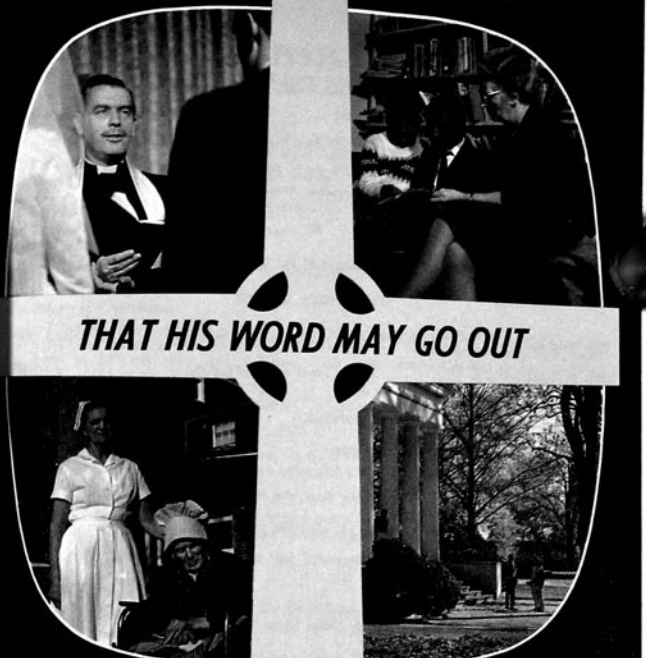

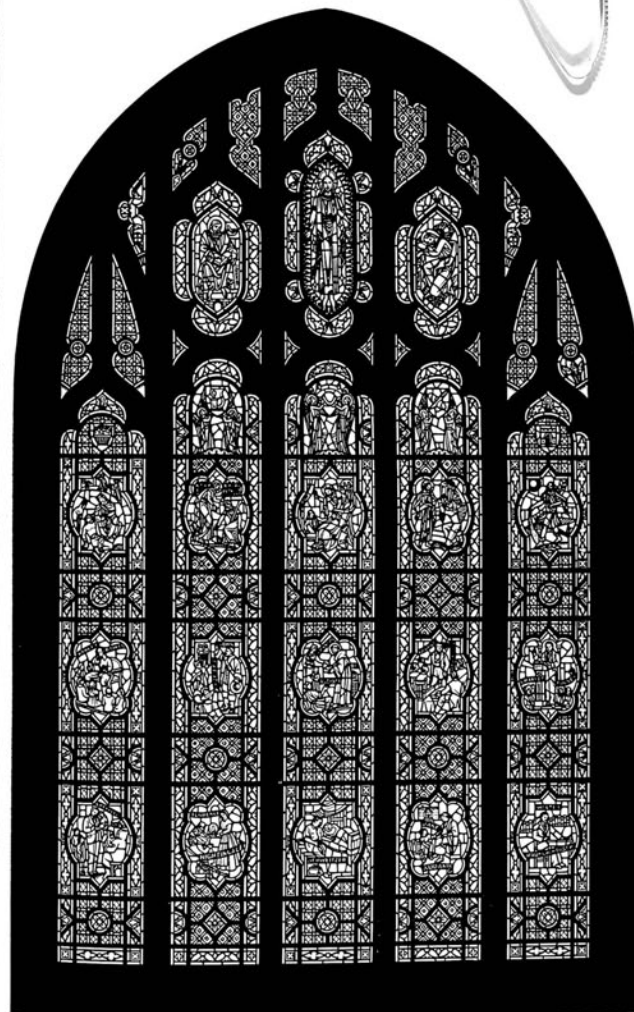

The two west windows to be dedicated this morning are given in loving memory of Dr. Albert Gallatin Hall, minister of this church from 1840-1871, and are given by his descendants, Mrs. E. Clinton Wolcott, Mrs. Selah Harris, Edward Harris, William Sloan and Richard Harris.

The windows were designed by the Willet Studios of Philadelphia. They portray Christ blessing the children. Christ is shown seated in the panel on the right. The left panel portrays two mothers, and one of the apostles who at first tried to prevent the children from coming close to Jesus. But the children carrying flowers run forward to give them to their Master.

The value Christ put on Children was unusual in the ancient world. "Except ye become as little children, ye shall not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven." He certainly knew that children are not always innocent and good. But they are spontaneous and affectionate, and this great and loving acceptance is a central characteristic of Christ's life. Thus the sermon this morning will deal quite naturally with the Christian home.
