Covenant of the Webster Baptist Church

Having been as we trust brought by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ, and to give ourselves wholly to Him; we do now solemnly covenant with each other to walk together in him with brotherly love to his glory as our common Lord. We do therefore in his strength engage that we will exercise a mutual care as members one of another to promote the growth of the whole body in Christian knowledge, holiness and comfort to the glory of God. That we may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God. To promote and secure this object we will uphold the public worship of God and the ordinances of his house and hold constant communion with each other therein. That we will cheerfully contribute of our substance for the support of the poor, and the maintenance of a faithful gospel ministry among us. That we will not omit closet and family religion at home nor allow ourselves in the too common neglect of the great duty of religious training up our children and those under our care with a view to the service of Christ and the enjoyment of heaven. That we will walk circumspectly in the world that we may save their souls, remembering that God hath not given us the spirit of fear but of love and of a sound mind. That we are the light of the world and the salt of the earth and as a city set on a hill cannot be hid. That we will frequently exhort and if occasion may require, admonish according to Matt 18:15 in the spirit of meekness considering ourselves also lest we be tempted. And that as in baptism we have been buried with Christ and raised again. So likewise there is on us a special obligation, hereafter to walk in newness of life. And may the God of peace, who brought again from the dead that great Shepherd of the sheep through the blood of the everlasting covenant make us perfect in every good work to do his will, working in us that which is well pleasing in his sight through Jesus Christ to whom be glory forever and ever.

Articles of faith & practice of the North Baptist Church

Art 1st We believe in one self-existent Independent & Eternal God who is a Spirit necessarily and eternally existing in three distinct Persons revealed to us in the scriptures by the appellations Father Son and Holy Ghost. Infinite in wisdom power holiness Justice goodness and Truth Who created all things by the word of his power for the display of his own glory and exercises a righteous government over all his creatures

Art 2^d We believe that God has revealed his character & will to us in the scriptures of the old & new testament which contain a plan & perfect rule of duty both to God & men

Art 3^d We believe that man created in the moral image of God by transgression fell from that estate & that through his disobedience all were made sinners and are under the curse of Gods Holy law

Art 4th We believe that God according to his good pleasure of his own will hath chosen a people in Christ that they should be holy & without blame before him in love and that this people will be brought in time through sanctification of the Spirit & belief of the Truth to repentance for sin & that they will be kept in a state of holiness by the power of God through faith unto salvation

Art 5th We believe that God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten Son the Lord from heaven to redeem & save lost sinners who by his obedience and suffering magnified the divine law

atoned for sin and opened an honorable way for the exercise of mercy to the guilty and perishing children children of men and that in consequence of his mediation the Holy Ghost is sent to convince sinners of their natural enmity to God their just desert of his wrath & to renew & sanctify their hearts and make them meet for the Kingdom of Glory

Art 6th We believe that sinners are freely justified by grace through the redemption that is in Jesus Christ

Art 7th We believe that the opposition of the sinner to the character and government of God is the only obstacle in the way of his performing the duties which God requires That all are called upon to repent & believe in the Lord Jesus Christ & that they are altogether inexcusable in sin

Art 8th We believe that good works are the fruits & only evidence of faith & repentance

Art 9th We believe that Baptism & the Lords supper are standing ordinances of the church & that they are to be practiced as instituted by Christ & practiced by his apostles

Art 10th We believe that baptism is a burial of the whole body in water and that such only as are baptised into the church or body of Christ have a right to participate at the Lords table

Art 11th We believe that a church of Christ is a body of baptised believers voluntarily associated together for the maintenance of the preaching & the ordinances of the gospel and for the mutual upbuilding of each other in

the most holy faith all drinking into the same spirit holding the same faith and exercising a careful watchfulness over each other

Art 12th We believe that it is the duty of the Church for the edification of the body to cultivate the gifts of the church & that for this purpose liberty should be extended to all the members to use their gifts according to the dictates of their own consciences & that it is the prerogative of the church to judge of their usefulness and approve or disapprove accordingly.

Art 13th We believe that every church of Christ has the right of governing & disciplining its own members that councils are merely advisory and the rule laid down in the eighteenth of matthew ought in all practicable cases to be attended to previous to complaints coming before the church

Art 14th We believe a majority of votes ought to be considered the voice of the church & the minority ought to submit after proper time for labor to produce uniformity of judgment

Art 15th We believe that those whom God has called to preach the gospel ought to live of the gospel and that it is the duty of the church according to the ability God has given them to impart of their substance for this purpose and that such as are negligent of this duty ought to be dealt with as in other cases of neglect

Art 16th We believe that brother ought not sue brother at the law in any ordinary case but that all controversies should be settled by a reference to the church or judicious neighbors

Art 17th We believe that the first day of the week is the christian sabbath and it should be sanctified by resting thereon from worldly labor

(excepting works of necessity) and by devoting the time to the worship of God & the religious instruction of our families

Art 18th We believe that it is the duty of all professors of religion who are heads of families to maintain the worship of God in their families by reading the scriptures & prayer daily both morning & evening

Art 19th We believe there will be a resurrection of the righteous & the wicked & that all must stand before the judgment seat of Christ there to be judged according to the deeds done in the body and that all will be retributed according to the righteous judgment of God

Pursuant to a vote of the Centurio & Penfield Church giving the brethren & sisters located on & in the vicinity of the Bridge liberty to organize themselves into a branch of that Church and attend to the ordinances of the Gospel. The brethren & sisters assembled at the place of worship & proceeded to organize themselves by electing Elder Jason Corwin Moderator and Asa B. Felt Clerk. & resolved to adopt articles of faith of the Casanova Church with amendment as the articles of faith of this Church. April 16-1830

 Reynolds is some what addicted to expressing
 himself indiscreetly & in a manner to create
 the suspicion of falsehood - We hope he will see
 and confess his faults in this respect particularly
 in relation to Miss Smith upon Bro Reynolds
 discovering a proper spirit in reference to these
 indiscretions we would recommend that the Church
 allow him to retain his standing in the denomination
 as a Christian & a minister - We would also aff-
 -ectionately advise Bro Reynolds and ^{the Church} in view of

The Building Committee then reported in substance, that in accordance with the object of their appointment, and the instructions given them by the Society, they have removed the old house of worship, and have taken the requisite measures to secure the erection of a new one on the same site, of such size and style as will meet the wishes of the Society so far as they understand them.

The work is now in a quite advanced stage of progress, and the walls of a substantial Church Edifice are already erected, so that the general style and plan of the house can now be seen.

By the terms of the contract which have been made, the house is to be enclosed and the basement finished for use during the present Autumn, and the entire building is to be finished during the coming Spring.

The entire cost of the building after the ground was prepared, and the field and cobble stone delivered on the ground is to be five thousand dollars.

A large proportion of the work of preparing the grounds and drawing the stone, has been performed gratuitously by members of the congregation, and the stone have nearly all been donated by citizens of the place. Of this generous liberality of the members of the congregation and others (amounting in the aggregate to some hundreds of dollars) the committee take great pleasure in making due acknowledgements.

On motion, the report was accepted, and the action of the committee thus far, approved.

X Br. H. N.
