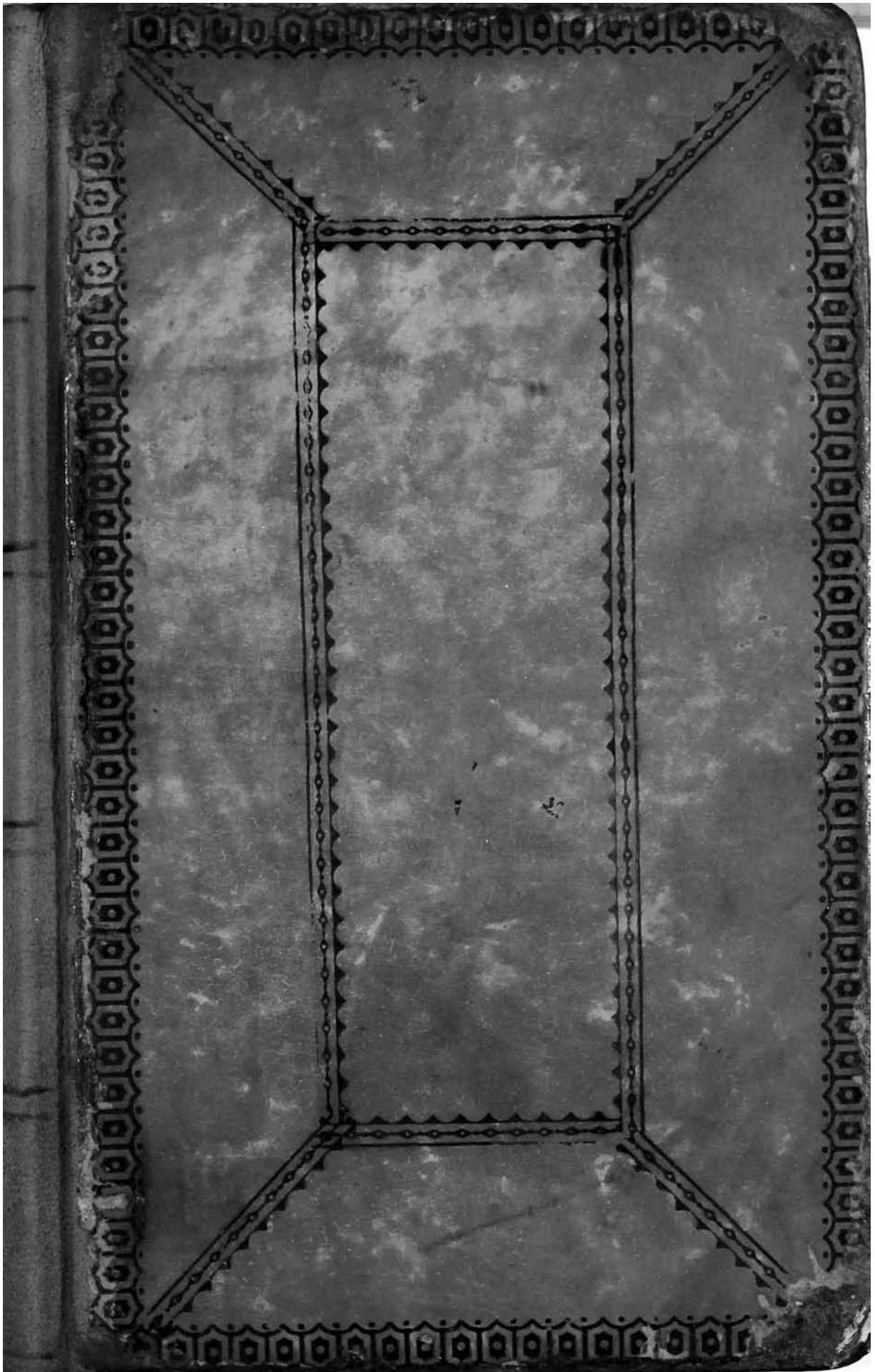

Covenant.

Having been, as we trust, brought by Divine Grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ, and to give ourselves wholly to him;— We do now solemnly Covenant with each other to walk together in him with brotherly love, to his glory as our common Lord. We do therefore in his strength engage that we will exercise a mutual care as members, one of another, to promote the growth of the whole body in Christian knowledge, holiness & comfort to the end that we may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God.

To promote and secure this object, we will uphold the public worship of God, and the ordinances of his House, and hold constant Communion with each other therein. That we will cheerfully contribute of our substance for the support of the Poor, and the maintenance of a faithful gospel ministry among us. That we will not omit Closet and Family Religion at home, nor allow ourselves in the too common neglect of the great duty of religiously training up our Children and those under our care with a view to the service of Christ, and the enjoyment of Heaven.

That we will walk circumspectly in the World, that we may win their souls—remembering that God hath not given us the Spirit of fear, but of love, and of a sound mind. That we are the Light of the World, and the Salt of the Earth, a City set on a hill, and cannot be hid.

That we will frequently exhort, and if occasion may require, admonish according to Mat 18th in the spirit of meekness, considering ourselves also, lest we be tempted.

And that as in Baptism we have been buried with Christ and raised again; so likewise there is on us a special obligation henceforth to walk in newness of life. And may the God of Peace, who brought again from the dead, that great Shepherd of the Sheep, through the blood of the Everlasting Covenant, make us perfect in every good work to do his will, working in us that which is well-pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forevermore. Amen.

Articles of Faith and Practice of the Webster (for North Penfield)
Baptist Church.

- Art. 1.st We believe in one self-existent, Independent and Eternal God, who is a Spirit, necessarily and eternally existing in Three distinct Persons, revealed to us in the Scriptures by the appellation, Father, Son, & Holy Ghost, — Infinite in Wisdom, Power, Holiness, Justice, Goodness and Truth. — Who created all things by the word of his power, for the display of his own glory, and exercises a righteous government over all his creatures.
- Art. 2.^d We believe that God has revealed his character and will to us in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament, which contain a plain and perfect rule of duty both to God and man.
- Art. 3.^d We believe that man, created in the moral image of God, by transgression, fell from that estate, and that through his disobedience all were made sinners and are under the curse of God's Holy Law.
- Art. 4.th We believe that God, according to the good pleasure of his own will, hath chosen a people in Christ, that they should be holy and without blame before him in love, and that this people will be brought, in time, through sanctification of the Spirit and belief in the Truth, to repentance for sin, and that they will be kept in a state of holiness by the power of God, through faith, unto salvation.
- Art. 5.th We believe that God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten Son, the Lord from Heaven, to redeem and save lost sinners, who, by his obedience and suffering, magnified the Divine Law, atoned for sin, and opened an honorable way for the exercise of mercy to the guilty and perishing children of men; — and that in consequence of his mediation the Holy Ghost is sent to convince sinners of their natural enmity to God, their just desert of his wrath, — and to renew and sanctify their hearts, and to make them meet for the Kingdom of Glory.
- Art. 6.th We believe that sinners are freely justified by Grace through the redemption that is in Jesus Christ.
- Art. 7.th We believe that the opposition of the sinner to the

character and government of God, is the only obstacle in the way of his performing the duties, which God requires— That all are called upon to repent and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and that they are altogether inexcusable in sin.

Art. 8. We believe that good works are the fruits and only evidence of faith and repentance.

Art. 9. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are standing ordinances of the Church, and that they are to be practiced as instituted by Christ, and practiced by his Apostles.

Art. 10. We believe that Baptism is a burial of the whole body in water, and that such only as are baptized into the Church or body of Christ, have a right to participate at the Lord's Table.

Art. 11. We believe that a Church of Christ is a body of baptized believers, voluntarily associated together for the maintenance of the preaching and the ordinances of the Gospel, and for the mutual upbuilding of each other in the most holy faith, all drinking into the same spirit, holding the same faith, and exercising a careful watchfulness over each other.

Art. 12. We believe that it is the duty of the Church, for the edification of the body, to cultivate the gifts of the Church, and that for this purpose liberty should be extended to all the members to use their gifts according to the dictates of their own consciences, and that it is the prerogative of the Church to judge of their usefulness, and approve or disapprove accordingly.

Art. 13. We believe that every Church of Christ has the right of governing and disciplining its own members— that Councils are merely advisory, and the rule laid down in the Eighteenth of Matthew ought in all practicable cases to be attended to, previous to complaints coming before the Church.

Art. 14. We believe a majority of votes ought to be considered the voice of the Church, and the minority ought to submit after proper time for labor to produce uniformity of judgment.

Art. 15. We believe that those whom God has called to preach the gospel, ought to live of the gospel, and that it is the duty of the Church according to the ability God has given them, to impart of their substance for this purpose, and that such as are negligent of this duty ought to be dealt with as in other cases of neglect.

- Art. 16. We believe that brother ought not sue brother at the law, in any ordinary case, but that all controversies should be settled by a reference to the church or judicious neighbors.
- Art. 17. We believe that the first day of the week is the christian sabbath, and it should be sanctified by resting thereon from worldly labor, (excepting works of necessity) and by devoting the time to the worship of God, and the religious instruction of our families.
- Art. 18. We believe that it is the duty of all professors of religion who are heads of families, to maintain the worship of God in their families by reading the scriptures, and prayer daily, both morning and evening.
- Art. 19. We believe there will be a resurrection of the righteous and the wicked, and that all must stand before the judgment seat of Christ, there to be judged according to the deeds done in the body, and that all will be retributed according to the righteous judgment of God.

Pursuant to a vote of the Ontario and Benfield Church, giving the Brethren and Sisters located on and in the vicinity of the Ridge, liberty to organize themselves into a Branch of that Church and attend to the ordinances of the gospel — The Brethren and Sisters assembled at the place of worship and proceeded to organize themselves by electing Elder Jason Corwin, Moderator, and Asa G. Telt. Clerk.

Resolved, To adopt Articles of Faith of the Casanova Church, with amendment, as the Articles of Faith of this Church.

Heard the Christian experience of Nansom Crippen, Burr Northrop, Ruth Crippen, Sally Baker, Libbens Kofs, Samuel Watson, Elisha Marlett, Eliza Baker, Maria Baker, Honor Kofs, and Mary Stevens.

Council convened agreeable to request and organized by appointing Elder Blakesly, Moderator, and Elder Marvin Allen, clerk. Delegates present from the following churches, viz: Rochester, Penfield, Marion, Penfield and Ontario, and Ontario Ridge.

Prayer by Elder Joseph Maltby. Council adjourned for thirty minutes. Prayer by Elder O. C. Cornstock. Proceeded to business, and after deliberation, unanimously agreed to extend fellowship to us as a church.

Death of Leason Luther Currier, one of the most active and zealous workers in the church and Sunday school who was ever ready to make any sacrifice for the advancement of the Master's Kingdom. His loss, from a human standpoint, seems irreparable; but the judges of all the earth doeth right and will vindicate in his own good time raise up one worthy to wear the mantle of the departed.

From May 1876 the date of his resignation Rev. E. Edwards - to January 1877 the church was not only destitute of a pastor but of any regular supply for the pulpit and during the closing months of '76 had no preaching service whatever except at irregular intervals. The prayer meeting and Sunday school however were maintained as usual and the prayers that were offered during that period of darkness and doubt were fully answered with the coming of the new year.

The meeting was more than usually interesting and made particularly so from the fact that then and there Rev. Chas. Ayer formally accepted the call of the church and began his new anointed work. At this meeting a very touching appeal ^{for aid} was read.

by the clerk from the gift of a former pastor of the church, Rev. E. J. Leitch. Bro. Field Mr. his appeal was made for the reason that Bro. Field having been visited by a terrible typhoid had left utterly destitute and all the property of Mr. Scott was swept from him or left in ruins in the space of a very few moments.

On listening to this appeal the church directed that it be re-read the following Sunday and a collection taken up for the benefit of the sufferers.

In accordance with these directions, the letter was again read and a collection, to the amount of \$14.15, taken up, which, together with a box of clothing and other necessities (the estimated value of the whole being over \$50.00) was sent, as directed, in response to the aforementioned appeal.

The beginning of the Pastorate of Rev. Jas. Ayer was the dawn of a new era for the church. Full of life and vigor and zeal for the cause of Christ he succeeded in infusing some of his own spirit into the lifeless members of the church. A result is obvious. Beginning with the week of prayer a series of very interesting meetings were held for several weeks resulting not only in quickening the majority of the church membership but also in the conversion and baptism into the church of five members of the Sunday school.

But the days of our prosperity were of short duration for with the following summer came a letter from the Home Mission Society requesting us to surrender our Pastor as the Lord had need of him elsewhere - needed him at the head of the new school for Freedmen at Atlanta Miss. It came like a death-knell to the church. All our hopes were crushed.

our prospects brighten; for rarely if ever has a pastor gained so strong a hold of the hearts of his people during so short a time, as did Mr. Ayer during his short Pastorate among us.

But we were forced to yield to the demands of duty and, after a long struggle with our innate selfishness, surrendering our pastor, feeling more than ever that "God's ways are not as our ways."

After the departure of Mr. Ayer the church was truly in a lamentable state. All our hope now centered in him that it was doubly difficult to choose his successor. Candidates in large numbers flocked about us all eager to do God's work among us but it was not until April 1878 that a pastor was settled in the person of Rev. J. P. Seely of Massing Jll.

Newton Stedee was chosen clerk. In harmony with a previous suggestion and in keeping with the custom of former years the meeting was adjourned until Monday morning December 10th at 7.30.

1896 The adjourned annual meeting of the Baptist Church and Society was held on Thursday-
 10th evening, December 10th at 7.30 o'clock in the Church. The night was dark and the roads were exceedingly bad and consequently the attendance was not more than seventy-five. The pastor presided and after appropriate devotional exercises the meeting proceeded to the election of two trustees to succeed brethren Newland and Stender whose terms of office expired. Mr. Newland was nominated to succeed himself and inasmuch as there were no more candidates the clerk was instructed to cast a single ballot in favor of Mr. Newland, which was accordingly done and Mr. Newland declared elected for a term of three years. Mr. Newton Stender was also nominated to succeed himself but he positively declined to serve in view of his having held a place in the board for six years. Mr. George G. Mason was then nominated and as there were no other candidates the clerk was instructed to cast a single ballot in favor of Mr. Mason, which was accordingly done and Mr. Mason declared elected for the term of three years.

The pastor presented a report of the Parsonage Fund and stated that all obligations were paid up to date. The amount due the New Homestead Loan Association at the present time is about \$850.00.

The Treasurer of the Church, Mr. Thomas Nagle presented a statement of the financial condition of the Church and stated that we were in debt to the extent of about \$300.00. One hundred and ninety dollars were due the pastor; fifty dollars due the sexton and there were several other bills, including \$53.00 insurance which brought the Church's obligations up to about

three hundred dollars.

The pastor then called for reports from the four committees whom he had appointed two weeks before to canvass the district with a view to securing pledges and money to meet the probable deficiency. The chairmen of the various committees reported and it was found that about \$270. out of the \$300. needed at the end of the year to cancel all obligations, had been subscribed and about \$75. actually paid in. These reports, in view of the prevailing hard times were very very gratifying.

The meeting then adjourned and partook of light refreshments and spent the rest of the evening in a social way.

X The pastor referred to the fact that we as a Church have been invited to co-operate with the Methodists and Presbyterians in the conduct of a series of special meetings to be begun early in September and the same to be under the leadership of Rev. M. S. Rees, an Evangelist of fine reputation and apparently of most earnest devotion. The invitation was cordially accepted and we look forward with prayerful anticipations to gracious results.

The pastor read a communication from the South Rochester Baptist Church asking that we send our pastor and two delegates to sit in council with representatives from the other churches in the Monroe Association to consider the desirability of setting apart to the Gospel ministry Brother Howard R. Chapman pastor elect of said Church. The pastor was chosen to represent us.

The following preamble and resolutions were presented to the church by our pastor and were accepted and ordered placed on the Church Record.

Whereas it has pleased Almighty God to take from our midst after a lingering illness of several years our beloved brother St. Nelson Curtice, & whereas our departed brother was a most devoted member of this church and a regular attendant since the year 1841, having shown singular fidelity to the welfare of the church, and having served in the capacity of Trustee, Choir-leader, Bible Class teacher and indeed in a score of useful and at times invaluable ways, & whereas for upwards of forty years Mr. Curtice has been our esteemed church clerk, therefore Resolved, that we inscribe on the records of the church these expressions of our appreciation of his prolonged faithfulness and invaluable services, & Resolved that a copy of these minutes be furnished his bereaved family.

Nov. 28 - Our beloved brother, Deacon Allyn W. Smith died on November 28th 1897 after a few months sickness. Deacon Smith was a royal man and a tower of strength and glory to our Church. His unquestioned integrity, undoubted piety, firm convictions, loving loyalty and kindly face and hand and heart made him a man that no Church could lose without serious loss. During the past few years we have lost many noble members, but we do no injustice to any of them when we say none were more highly respected and tenderly loved than he. The funeral occurred on Wednesday Dec. 1st at which ~~our~~ pastor, Rev. Joseph Weston officiated, assisted by Rev. E. Packwood of Watertown, N.Y. a former pastor of Deacon Smith's at York and a life long friend of the family.

Dec 15th The annual meeting of the Baptist Church & Society was held on Saturday evening December 14th 1897. Our pastor, was chosen chairman and our church treasurer, Thomas Nagle was chosen clerk. Inasmuch as the night was unfavorable and it being generally understood that nothing more would be done than organize and adjourn to a more suitable time, the attendance was small. Accordingly we adjourned to meet on Tuesday evening Dec. 14th but when this evening came there came with it a blinding snow storm of a most severe character and a meeting was out of the question. Accordingly we postponed the meeting until the following evening Dec. 15th. At this meeting George Aldwin was chosen as Trustee for three years to succeed himself and John Schenck

was chosen to succeed A. J. Pratt whose term of office had expired and who declined re-election. The Church Treasurers report showed a deficiency of about \$160.⁰⁰ for which no pledges had been made and after some discussion as to "what are you going to do about it", the pastor was asked if he would not make a special appeal some fine Friday morning and see if the amount could not be raised in that way. The Trustees were also urged to re-insure the church as soon as possible which they promised to do.

1898. The seventy-first anniversary of the Monroe Baptist Association was held at Webster on October 6th & 7th. The attendance was very large and the arrangements on the part of our Church admirable. Refreshments were provided for about 400 twice each day & about 200 were taken care of over night. Everybody expressed themselves as being very much gratified with generous provision made & the excellent program provided. Our Church letter which was presented to the Association was as follows:

"Of course the thought which is uppermost in our hearts and minds these days is the coming of our brethren & sisters from the churches of our beloved Monroe Baptist Association. It is now seventeen years since we have had the honor of entertaining the Association & it is with peculiar pleasure that we welcome you to-day. To say that we are unmindful

of the labor involved would not be true but notwithstanding we can say with all sincerity, "I thank God upon every remembrance of you. Always in every company of mine making request with joy for your fellowship in the Gospel from the first day until now. Being confident of this very thing that he which hath begun a good work in you will continue it until the day of Christ." In the name of our Pastor, our Church and our Lord we bid you welcome.

With reference to our own Church we may say the year has been one of earnest and arduous labor in a variety of ways. The spiritual results have not been so apparent as on some former years but the work may have not been any the less valuable and permanent on that account. We have two awaiting baptism at the present time and we have a right to expect a growing work of grace during the coming winter.

We ought to say in justice to ourselves that we have lost and are losing very heavily through death & removal. Since the first of April of the present year no less than thirty worthy members of our Church, Sunday-school or Congregation have moved away from our village or vicinity and of course we are correspondingly weakened. Rochester, Williston, Medina, Lakeside, East Orange, Yorkton, Schodack Landing and other places now contain our members, and unfortunately those who have come into our township to take their places are mostly people of

foreign birth and are not in sympathy in large part, with Protestant Churches. Of course this constant depletion, in spite of the earnest & arduous work of our Pastor, is making serious inroads into our congregations Sunday-school - Y.P.S.C.E. However, we are at the battle to win and while we cannot rejoice in large additions & growing benevolence we do know that more grit and grace & gumption are required in standing by the staff and in strengthening the things which remain, than in reporting large accessions and large benevolences under other & more favorable circumstances.

The prospective Electric Rail Road from Rochester toodus Bay may bring an increase to our available population, and both we and the other Churches in town may reap some benefit, but "we shall see what we shall see."

During the year we have lost by death three aged and highly respected members of our Church - Deacon Allyn W. Smith, ^{from} whom no Church was ever blessed with a truer or a better man and brethren Henry Loeel & Henry Smith, both quiet, useful and godly men. "Their works do follow them."

" Pledges towards a fund to remodel repair and refurbish the church building were circulated by our Pastor Rev. George A. Brass and in July 1902 it became evident that from those returned signed that the estimated amount required to make all necessary repairs could be secured therefore.

" At a meeting of the Webster Baptist Church held after morning service. - Due notice of same having been given the Pastor announced that sufficient funds had been pledged towards the contemplated repairs to warrant the appointment of a Building Committee and the following were duly elected to serve the Church in such capacity. Our Pastor Rev. Geo. A. Brass. Geo. F. Wiser. John Harris. Arthur Denbner. Geo. J. Mason. Wm. Stanton Mrs. Holt and Mrs. Smith. - Eight.

Aug. 24. 1902
 "Meeting of the Church after Sabbath School Mr. Scribner having refused to act on the committee the Church elected Bro. H. L. Naudette to serve in his place.

Aug. 27. 1902
 "Special Meeting of the Church to hear a report of the Building Com. which presented the following.

Your Building Committee would respectfully report as follows. We have received plans for repairing the church building from various architects and after carefully studying and comparing them have decided that the plan presented by Mr. Chas. Randall is the most economical and best adapted to our needs and resources which plan we herewith submit and recommend its adoption.

The Secy. then explained the plans and after a free discussion it was unanimously voted to adopt the report as presented and instruct the Com. to proceed with the work.

Upon the recommendation of the Building Committee Bro. G. F. Harris the Church Clerk was added to the

Committee making nine members.

Owing to the program of repairs no services could be held in the Church during Oct. Nov. and Dec. 1902 and Jan and Feb. 1903 up to the 24. upon which date the formal Profaning was held. The Annual Meeting was also held upon this date the minutes of which were kept upon a separate paper and last before being transcribed. Bro. W. Stanton was elected as Church Clerk and Geo. F. Mason, Trustee. The Building Committee presented the following report which is copied from the minutes of said committee.

Webster, N.Y.

Feb. 20. 1903

"To the Webster Baptist Church.
 Brethren.

Your Building Committee respectfully submit the following report. The condition of our church edifice had for some time been a growing cause of anxiety, - and we may say chagrin, owing to its urgent need of repairs.

The leaking roof, loose defective windows, ruined decorations, leaking steam pipes, poor lights, slim walls, uncomfortable floors, antiquated furniture, faded draperies, ragged carpets and the wet musty useless basement were a constant and a growing reproach. But hampered by our

old mortgage upon the parsonage the work seemed too great an undertaking for us until the mortgage was finally cancelled and publicly burned at a meeting called for the purpose. The people went away rejoicing and as it now appeared had found new hope, fed by two noble gifts of \$500⁰⁰ each they at once rose up to rebuild the House of God. It was at first planned to completely remodel the interior besides making the necessary repairs and it was thought \$3000⁰⁰ would be more than needed so although it looked large it seemed best to make it large enough to surely do the work for everyone felt that 'there must be no more debt'. The pledge cards were accordingly made binding upon the condition that the full \$3000⁰⁰ be subscribed and our Pastor went to work to secure the pledges. How earnestly he labored and how well he succeeded is shown by the fact that what we had considered impossible he very soon assured us would be accomplished and July 27, 1902, a meeting of the Church was held to take action upon the matter. The minutes of that meeting upon the Church Record read as follows.

July 27, 1902

"Meeting of the Church held after

morning services. - due notice having been given. - the Pastor announced that sufficient funds had been pledged toward the contemplated repairs and remodeling to justify the appointment of a Building Committee and the following were duly elected to serve the Church in such capacity, viz.
 Rev. Geo. F. Beers. Geo. G. Wier
 John Harris. Arthur Scribner
 Geo. J. Masan. Wm. Stanton
 Mrs. Halt and Miss Smith
 Eight members.

Mr. Scribner declined to act and Aug. 24 the Church elected J. L. Hurdle to serve in his place. Aug. 29, at the request of the Com. the Church added to the Com. its Clerk J. F. Harris and this Com. of nine as thus formed has continued to act as your Building Com.

The Committee met for organization July 29 and elected officers as follows. President, J. G. Wier Secretary, Wm. Stanton and Treasurer, Geo. J. Masan. Sub-committees were appointed and our work began at once. Since that date the Com. has held 23 meetings, besides numerous meetings of sub-committees of which no minutes were kept.

The first thing was to find out just what repairs were necessary secure plans, estimates and bids on the work. Within the first week we had consulted architects, contractors, carpenters, machinists, glaziers

curators and painters, besides doing a large amount of investigating on our own account.

"Everywhere we went we found repairs needed. from a cistern in the basement to clapboards on the tower and we soon saw that the extensive remodeling at first contemplated was entirely out of the question, and we set to work to decide upon a plan of refurnishing which would disturb as little as possible the then existing structures. The selected plan was a modification of one of the four submitted and was estimated to cost about \$2700.00 for roof and interior work.

But before proceeding to carry it into effect the Church was called together Aug. 29 and the plan upon which the Committee had settled as fully explained as possible. It followed out the colonial style of architecture and preserved the personality of the building so dear to many of - especially the older - members.

Today we again present you that plan worked out in ceiling, windows, pews, carpet lighting and in all the added conveniences of the basement.

"Being authorized to proceed we soon found many items would of necessity exceed the estimates. Take for example the roof. We first thought \$75.00 to \$100.00 would repair the old roof. but found that no one would take the job and

guarantee it against leaks. Nothing but a new roof would ensure a dry auditorium. Then came the study of different kinds of roofs. Shingles were impractical because no one would warrant even new shingles on so flat a roof. To raise the pitch would add expense and destroy the architectural beauty of the building. We worked long and hard on the problem and finally decided that the best and most economical way was to cover the roof with rubberoid at an expense of \$230.00 besides freight carting and the board of the roofers. Thus the roof exceeded the estimate by over \$150.00.

"The seating was estimated at \$500.00 but the bids ranged from \$720.00 to \$995.00 for finished pews. We found \$500.00 would buy pews only a little better than our old ones and after carefully considering the matter and making a number of samples the committee unanimously agreed that the best thing to do was to put in a seating which would at once be handsome, comfortable and substantial, and we do not hesitate to say that we are proud of the pews and fully expect you all to be likewise pleased although our estimate was exceeded by \$220.00.

"The one item which has probably caused us more care, worry and study than any other is that of

heating. The estimate was \$680.00 which did not contemplate heating the basement. We found the old boiler not only antiquated but unsafe. A new boiler must be had and we decided to put in one capable of heating the entire house but not put in the radiation below at present. Upon this basis the estimate of \$800.00 was made and we received one bid at just that figure. But finding that we would have a quantity of old pipe which could be used to make radiators suitable for the basement we decided to buy the needed new materials at the prices bid and hire the work ourselves and so put in the complete system at once believing it could be done cheaper than at another time. We also placed a large register in the vestibule and have one extra radiator which may be used in the bathroom room or old prayer room as our needs may indicate. This of course requiring some new pipe, valves and couplings. The boiler had to be lowered in order to secure returns without placing the radiators in the basement several feet above the floor and more labor was required. The complete plant has cost approximately \$630.00 being \$130.00 above the estimate and giving us heat to the basement and vestibule for that sum.

"The decorating also slightly exceeded the estimate which was \$250.00 for the auditorium and vestibule. The lowest bid from what we considered reasonable bidders was \$242.00 for the work alone, we to build the staging. This we ascertained would cost us about \$25.00. The next bid was \$250.00 for the work alone or \$270.00 and build their own staging. There being practical no difference in price between these two, the contract was let to the one who submitted the design considered by us most in keeping with the architecture of the room and best calculated to add beauty and dignity. Our estimate was exceeded by \$20.00 but we are pleased with the result.

"Even the carpet exceeded the estimate by \$27.00 and in the basement it was the same on a smaller scale. windows had to be reset new sills, new mouldings etc. were required where not expected.

"The windows came \$15.00 below the estimate on the eleven. Only one bid was received but we believe we have excellent value received for the price paid.

"So far as possible all old material was worked in to save buying new. In this way we realized more from the old fund as lumber than we could sell them for. A large part of the basement and vestibule heating

is with the best of the old pipe carefully assorted and cut so as to use the best. Even the lining of the old baptistry was utilized to line the new sink in the kitchen.

"Keeping in mind your injunction 'There must be no debt' your committee have from time to time cut off different items from the contemplated improvements. First we had to abandon the inclined floor and change in the vestibule. Then the idea of an acetylene gas flant had to be reluctantly given up. Then we decided to be content with the old pulpit furniture and it seemed that we must even continue to settle the old front doors. But there are those who love the Church too well to let the work remain unfinished and prompted by that love put their shoulders to the wheel and lifted hard just when and where their help was most needed.

"First the Ladies Aid Society which had already given liberally toward the \$3000.00 came forward and authorized the committee to put in the acetylene flant at their expense. - not to exceed \$250.00. We succeeded in installing the complete flant for about \$230.00. Then came the beautiful gift of the pulpit set. A few more subscriptions. Then the new front doors and the fixtures for them

the paper for the basement. The matting for the upper vestibules, besides many donations of labor so that although we have gone far beyond the estimate and the original subscriptions; as our Treasurers report will show there is still no debt. It is all yours to enjoy to the honor of the Master.

"To be sure there is still the outside painting which should be done as soon as the weather will permit, but we hope it may be completed with the promised subscriptions not yet received.

"In concluding this somewhat lengthy report your Building Committee desires to thank you for your patience and kind indulgence during the long weeks the work has been in progress. No doubt it has seemed to you that the work has dragged. It has almost seemed so to us at times, but only those who have been intimately associated with the work can have an adequate idea of the great amount of labor and attention which has been required to accomplish the changes you see about you both in the Auditorium and in the basement. We trust you will be pleased with the returns we give you for your generosity. We have striven to use the funds wisely - to make improvements of a durable kind. We

have tried to maintain harmony
in color and design and secure
a plain, chaste, substantial beauty
worthy and befitting a house dedi-
cated to the worship of God.

for several months during the program of repairs all services were discontinued leaving us practically only about eight months work from which to make a year's report.

Our repair work consisted of a new roof, leaded glass windows, circular fawn, pulpit set, heating plant, carpets, baptistry and an acetylene gas plant. Remodeling the basement so as to provide spacious and convenient dining-room, kitchen, prayer and cloak rooms, and the redecorating of the interior of the whole building.

The Ladies Aid Society deserve especial mention for their very substantial work the past year the complete lighting plant and carpet being supplied by them at a cost of \$331.34.

Our balances, which although not what we had hoped, show a gain which when we consider that we have been taxed to our utmost in making the quite extensive repairs is encouraging.

Unavoidable delays in completing our baptistry prevent our reporting any baptisms as several await the ordinance.

The attendance which was light during the summer is improving, especially that of the prayer meetings.

There is earnest prayerful longing for an outpouring of His Spirit which with the earnest faithful labors of our Pastor and

As your retiring Church Clerk I wish to call your attention to the importance of a thorough revision of the Church Roll, no such revision having been made as I can ascertain since about 1867. And for the last few years at least owing to the confused state of the Roll the annual reports of membership have been obtained from the previous report by adding the gains, and subtracting the losses, as they appeared on the records, or could be remembered by the Pastor and Clerk for each year.

In this manner we this year reported 171 members whereas I was only able to find 162, to which I have added 4 names with no other authority than my personal knowledge that they have been active members with us for years, thus making 166.

There may be others to raise the number but I am satisfied that there is also quite a few who should be stricken from the list and there are many who are entirely unknown to me.

(Then followed a list of the 166 names, which upon the objection of Pastor Bragg was not read.)

I hope some action will be taken towards clearing this list of the spiritual and physical dead and inactive. I referred to this last year but it was passed over. I also urged the importance of furnishing the clerk minutes for recording of all business transacted during his absence and am glad to report improvement in this matter, but again I wish to urge Pastor and members to be more particular in furnishing my successor minutes of all matters relating to membership viz. baptisms, excommunication, deaths, marriages etc. that a list of members, having some value as a source of data may be prepared and maintained.

score was most devoted to the work of the
kingdom: thoughts of Mrs. Pratt recall fragments
of an old song, "Who plows or sows matter not
to the reaper, I'm only remembered by what
I have done": long will she be remembered
by what she has done.

Dr. N. Curdace Holt was ever ready to serve
his master, he labored always to build
up the church he loved, to him his Lords
commands were never grivous. To day he

knows that "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city." As we look back we are not satisfied with our years work; we do not commend ourselves, but we do acknowledge with gratitude the watchcare of our heavenly Father and lift up our hearts in thanksgiving that the foundation of our faith is Christ Jesus. Once more we commit all we are and have to Him.

The year has been one of earnest and
 constant work in various ways.

The pastor and other workers have
 endeavored to make the year a success
 financially, to promote fellowship among

the members and to deepen the spiritual life of the church.

In March we held union evangelistic meetings with three other churches: at these meetings some of our young people were converted and afterwards baptized. Baptist Union of Rochester & Monroe County.

The past year has been a very satisfactory year ~~for~~ for our church. Increased interest has been shown in the various departments of the church.

In December our church united with the other churches of the village in a three weeks evangelistic campaign for the benefit of the community. Rally day services were held in both the church and Sunday School early in the winter which helped to build up new interests especially in the Sunday School. During the year the men and young men of the church organized themselves into a men's ~~club~~ Bible and Civic Club with about 50 members. They hold monthly meetings on a

week day night and are addressed by a visiting pastor or layman who has a message for men. On Sunday they meet at the Sunday School hour as a class in the school, and we hope this organization may be of great service to the kingdom of God. From 30 to 40 members of the class have been in attendance at Sunday School on frequent occasions, and Sunday School workers from Rochester often addressed the class during the winter months.

Our church gave \$40 to the Golden Jubilee Fund. The Ladies Aid and Missionary Society are both working hard to help the church. They hold their regular meetings each month.

Death has taken three of our members. Rev. C. B. - g. Two representatives from the Young Peoples Organization.

2. That this Advisory Board shall elect from its membership the following officers: Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Secretary.

3. That this Advisory Board shall meet at the call of the Pastor or Chairman.

4. That a group known as the Pastors Cabinet shall be organized which shall consist of the following:

- * a. One Deacon elected by the Board of Deacons, and,
- * b. One Trustee elected by the Board of Trustees, and,
- c. The Chairman of the Finance Committee, and,
- d. The Treasurer of the Church, and,
- e. The Superintendent of the Church School, and,
